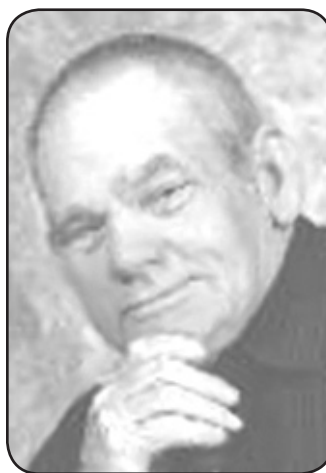

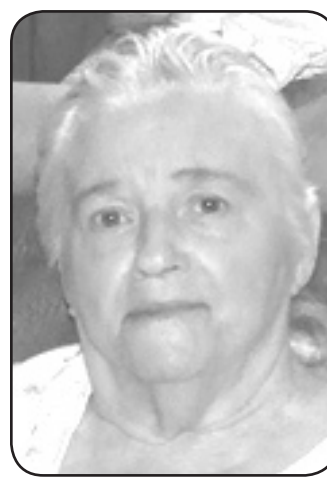
Cecile Patton, 87
