ECHS is most improved on school report cards District ranks 31st in Kentucky

The Kentucky Department of Education released school report cards on Friday, September, 27th for each district in the state of

Kentucky. While one school in Estill County had shown a great deal of improvement since tests were given to students back in the spring, there are two schools in the county that are considered 'focus' schools by the Kentucky Department of Education.

Students are tested in each school in the county in the following areas: Language Mechanics, Reading, Math, Science, and Social Studies.

Under the new standards that were implemented in the state of Kentucky last year there are several factors that come into play when determining the school report card. They look at achievement, gap, growth, graduation rate, and college and career readiness and formulate the score from those areas.

The district as a whole is classified as 'needs improvement/progressing' according to the report, but showed significant improvement since the 2011-2012 school year.
