Estill Engineers Boys Golf Team Back To Back Region Champs

It has been a couple of busy, yet very successful, weeks for the boys golf team.

On September 21st, the boys traveled to Powell County to play in the Wolfe County Invitational.

Estill entered two teams in the tournament. Even though the Engineers were missing Travis Adams and Caleb Click due to the ACT, they still came out with a first place and third place finish.

The scoring was as follows:

First team - Phillip Webb (individual medalist) 69, Ryan Freeman 74, Andrew Farmer 78, Benton Kirby 82, and Trent Sparks 83.

Second Team - Joe Benton 84, Jay Winkler 85, Makane Short 95, and in his first ever high school golf tournament 5th grader Cobbe Click scored 112.

On September 28th the team played in Paintsville's annual tournament.

With a very competitive field of teams the Engineers once again came out victorious. With a team score of 301 the boys just edged out Ashland who scored 303 on the day.

The scoring was as follows: Travis Adams 73, Andrew Farmer 74, Phillip Webb 76, Ryan Freeman 78, and Benton Kirby's 92.

The second team had a great showing as well posting a 334 and finishing in 6th place.

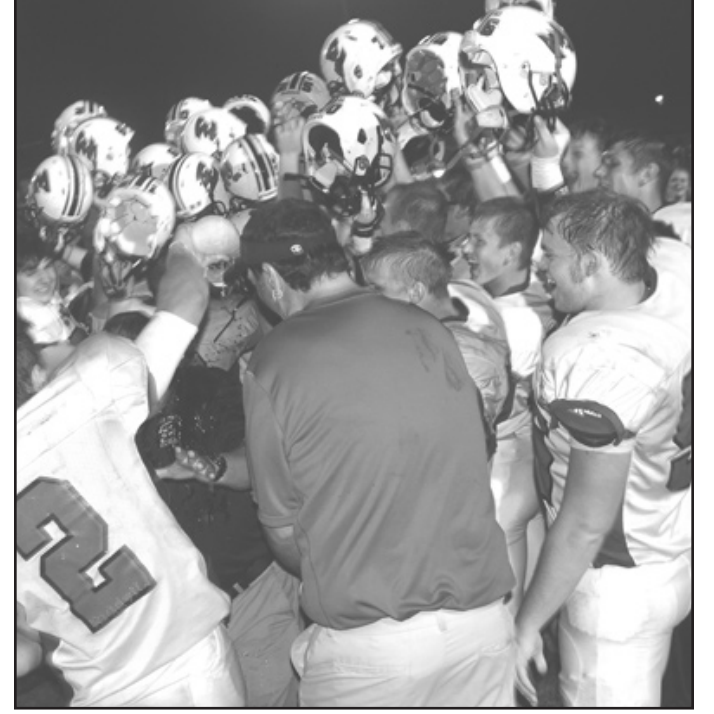
Game times start at 5:30. Come on out and support these ladies as they make a push for the postseason and Commonwealth Conference championship. Go Lady Patriots!!!!!!

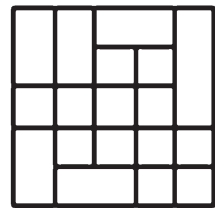


The Engineers celebrate the big win.
