Richmond police charge Irvine woman w/burglary; then arrests Irvine man on robbery charge

Walmart twice last Wednesday to possibly make arrests on shoplifting charges. Instead two Irvine residents were charged with burglary and robbery in separate incidents.

RPD first went to Walmart around 1 p.m. to investigate an attempted

Walmart employees told Richmond police officers that Shona R. Harrison, 36, was selecting merchan-

Richmond Police went dise from display shelves. They added she took the merchandise directly to customer service and attempted to return the items to receive a refund.

RPD says that Harrison had previously been banned from Walmart's premises. They say because she entered the store to commit a theft after being banned, this resulted in the burglary charge against her.

RPD received the second complaint with a shoplifting incident around 7 p.m.

Upon arrival, RPD was told that Farril L. Tipton, 33, attempted to leave Walmart without paying for \$15.74 in merchandise. A Walmart employee reportedly attempted to detain Tipton. Walmart says Tipton struck the employee in the face and fled on
