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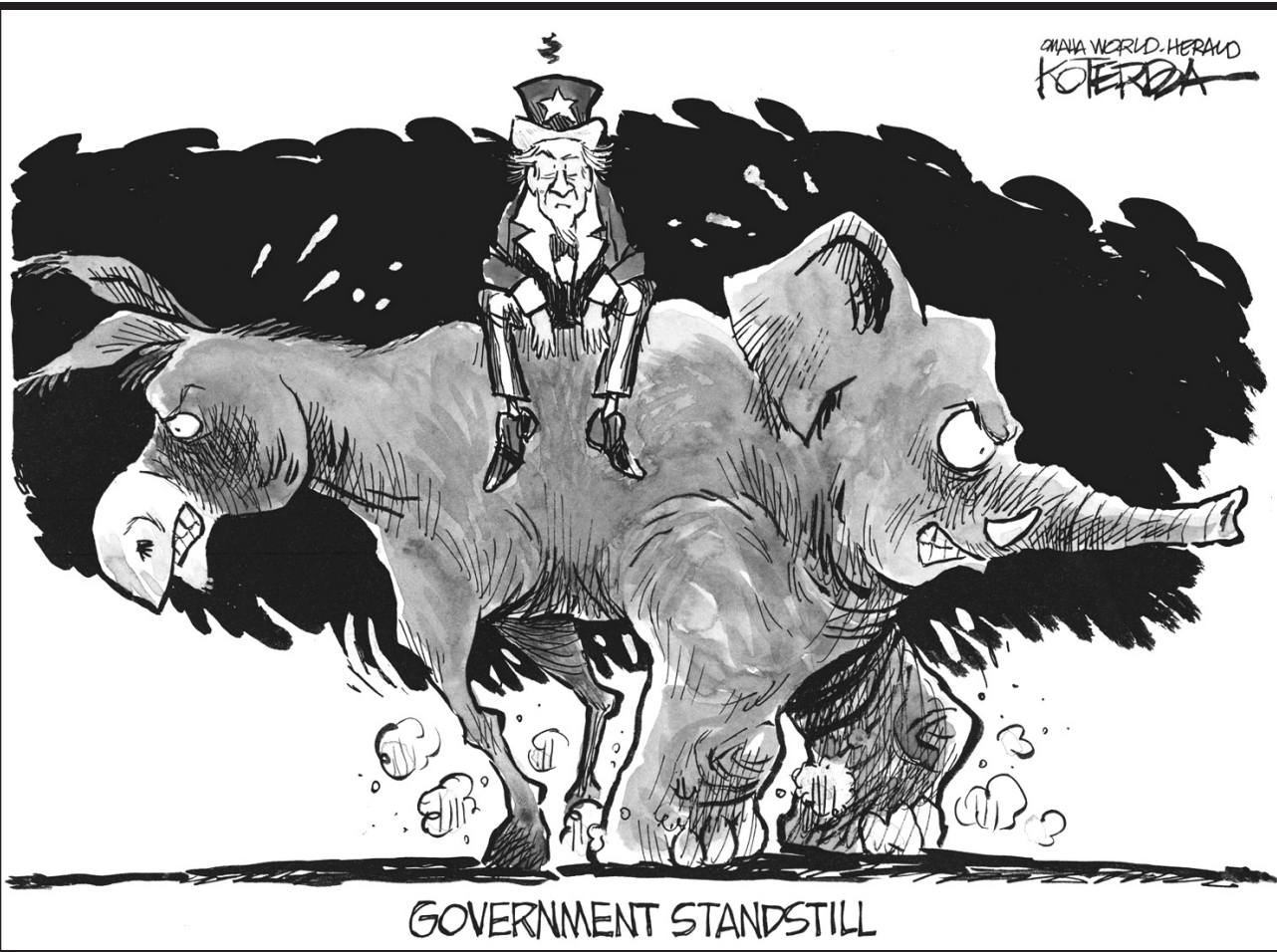
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Maudie's Naughties

Parks Commissioner to Speak at Natural Bridge Dinner

This coming Friday evening, October 11, 2013, the Natural Bridge State Park Association Board will be holding its Annual Dinner/Election of Officers meeting at the Park's Activities Building. Dinner will be served at 6 p.m.

A half hour, "Happy Hour" will begin at 5:30 p.m. Pianist Travis Wickline will be playing and entertaining the crowd before and during the meal. The public is invited to attend.

The cost of dinner is \$20 per person. Tickets are available at the door. Board members are asked to bring a gift to be given away as a door prize. Election of officers for the coming year will be held near the end of the meeting.

The featured speaker for the annual meeting is Elaine N. Walker, the Commissioner of the Kentucky Department of Parks. She is a former mayor of Bowling Green. She served as mayor for six years and created four

additional city parks during her tenure.

The Commissioner has a full time staff of 900 people. The figure doubles during the summer. She oversees a total of 49 state parks. This includes 17 State Resort Parks, recreational parks and historic sites. Long ago Kentucky established a tradition of having the finest state park system in the nation. She says her mission is to build on that strong tradition.

She was the first Bowling Green Mayor to be elected to successive terms. Under her leadership the city added 34 small businesses and 5,000 jobs. Bowling Green is the

third largest city in the state.

Mrs. Walker is past president of the Kentucky League of Cities, the chair of the Women Mayors of America's Cities and Trustee of the Conference of Mayors. She has represented her city at a number of international business conferences. She has also served as Kentucky's Secretary of State.

She and her husband and business partner, Dorian, have been married 35 years and have two children. Erin is a Senior Manager of Programming Finance for MSNBC and Evan is an engineer with Turner Universal.

Nine students from Estill County named Sen. Jeff Green Scholars

Nine 2013 graduates of Estill County High School have been named Senator Jeff Green Scholars by the Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority (KHEAA) for outstanding academic performance in high school. Students earn this designation by achieving a 4.0 grade point average each year of high school and scoring at least a 28 composite on the ACT.

Local students who earned this prestigious designation are Andrew Abernathy, Aaron Burgher, Tanner Chaney, Erin Combs, Jantzen Day, Kalen Freeman, Brett Noland, Mallory Puckett and Corey Thomas.

These students have also earned \$2,500 a year in Kentucky Educational Excellence Scholarship (KEES) awards. Their awards may be renewed each year of college if they continue to earn high grades, making the total value of their KEES worth \$10,000.

The title honors the late

state Sen. Jeff Green of Mayfield, who served in the Kentucky General Assembly from 1992 to 1997.

KEES and other Kentucky student aid programs are administered by KHEAA. KEES awards are funded by net Kentucky lottery proceeds and may be used at most colleges and universities in Kentucky. In some cases, the award may be used at out-of-state schools if the major the student is pursuing is not available in Kentucky. No application is necessary for KEES awards, and students may access their KEES account information on www.kheaa.com by setting up a MyKHEAA account.
