

# Estill Boys and Girls Soccer Teams Are District Winners

Both the Estill County Boys and Girls Soccer Teams are district winners and will advance to 14th Region action which will be announced later in the week.

The Estill Girls Team is the only team in their district and will advance by default to the regionals as the 54th District winner.

Coach Candie McMaine's team finished the season with a 10-0 shutout at Middlesboro for a 11-5-1 record which is just slightly

behind the Lady Engineers' best season ever at 11-4-1 in 2012.

The 2013 Lady Engineers also finished the season undefeated in the region, 3-0, with two wins over Perry County Central and a single win over Letcher County Central.

Estill did not play the fourth team in the 14th Region, the Hazard Lady Bulldogs, who finished 0-4 against PCC and LCC.

Estill County's Boys

Team captured their first ever district win on Monday night in Jackson City, defeating the defending district champion, 11-1. The Engineers will advance as the 54th District winner.

Andrew Witt got 4 goals, Justin Marshall 3 goals, and Travis Neal, Josh Baber, Austin Witt and Tyler Ratliff got one goal each while Boone Tucker had 4 assists.

For Jackson City, Rader Davidson scored their only goal.

Under Coaches Tim Tipton and Greg Witt, Estill's boys completed their best season ever, 11-4-3, just a week ago with a 9-0 win over the same team, Jackson City. This was the best Estill Engineers boys soccer team since their only other winning season in 2009 when they went 12-8-2.

The Engineers, like their counterpart, the Lady Engineers, are also undefeated in region play, but with two ties, both to Perry County

Central.

Senior Andrew Witt was listed as 8th among scorers in the state before playing the two Jackson City games. Witt had 31 goals in 18 games for a 1.7 average. He put in two in the October 7th Jackson City game and added four more on Monday night.

Estill's boys are led by a group of close seniors and every senior has scored at least one goal this season.

Coaches Tipton and

Witt have worked together since youth soccer and have brought the team together after the absence of Tipton in previous seasons because of work-related issues.

Coach McMaine assistant Andrew Hatton have also brought the girls team together and the Lady Engineers have played well for the past two seasons.

yard pass from quarterback Trevor Jones, and Jones kept the ball for the extra two points.

The win moved Estill to 4-4 overall and 3-1 in the district, which assures them of a playoff game.

What's not decided is whether Estill will play at home or away in playoffs against teams from the sister district, which will be probably be determined by the Estill-Garrard matchup on October 25th.

The Engineers are idly this week while Garrard will be taking on Western Hills.

Bourbon, Estill, and likely Garrard are in the playoffs with Powell, Bath and Western Hills fighting for the extra slot in the six-team district.
