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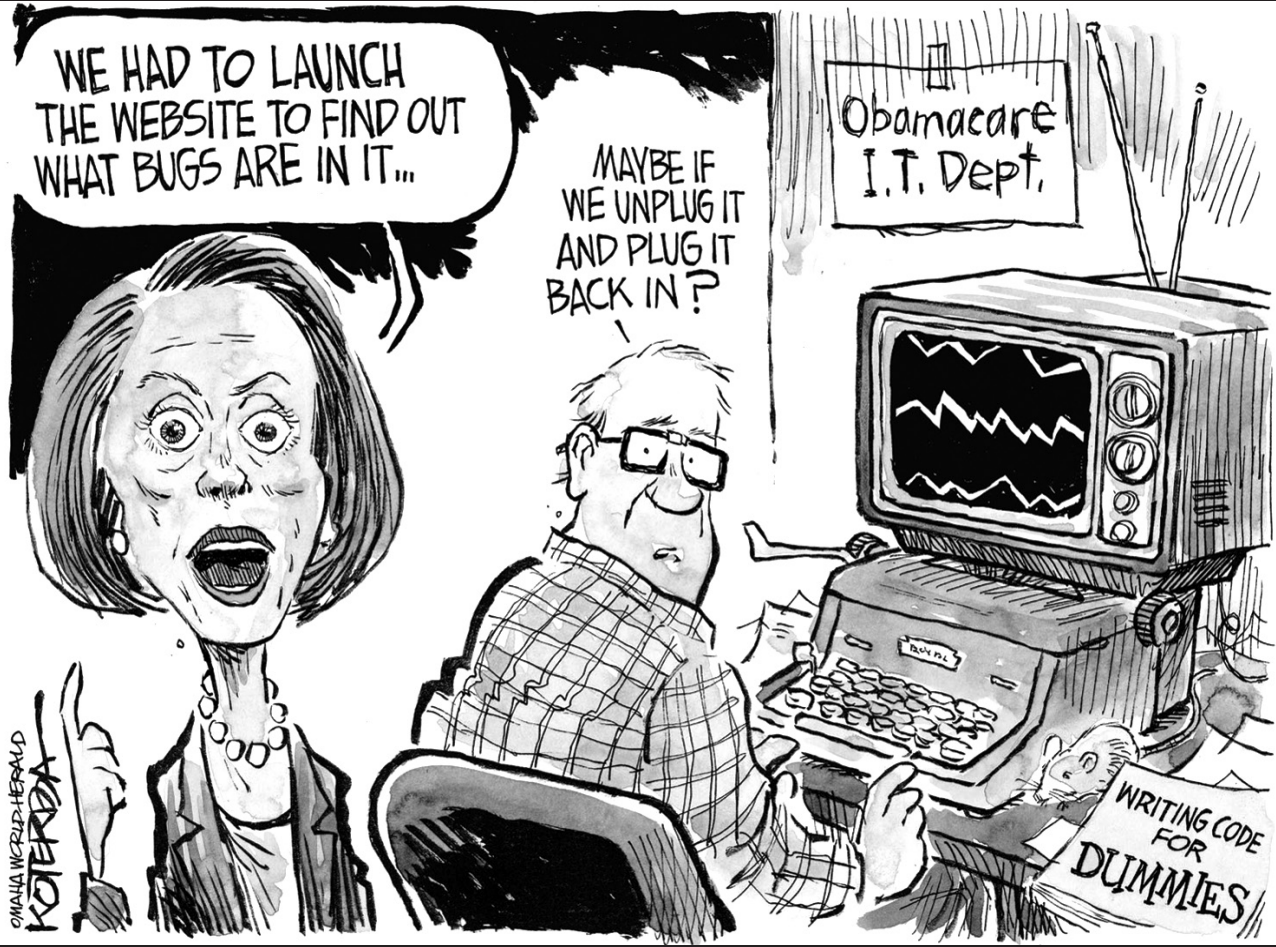
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Maudie's Naughties

Visitors for the big event can expect woolly worm racing, almost non-stop entertainment from cloggers and musical groups such as the Moron Brothers, Common Ground and Coal Town Dixie. nual Youth Pet Show begins at 10 a.m. Friday.

The Festival opens at 9 a.m. each morning and goes until 10-11 each night. A talent show will begin at 12 noon on the Main Stage Friday and the official Opening Ceremony will be held at 6 p.m. Friday on the Main Stage to honor the "Citizen of the Year", "Volunteer of the Year", etc.

On Saturday a medieval sword fighting performance will begin at 10 a.m. The annual parade begins at 1 p.m. Floats, Fire Departments, civic groups, churches, antique cars and marching groups welcome.

The 26th Annual Car Show begins at 9 a.m. Sunday - Top 100, Best of Show and various other awards. D.J. Charlie Napier will spin the tunes. Church services and gospel music beginning at 11 a.m.
