#### Fall Revival At Ivory Hill Baptist

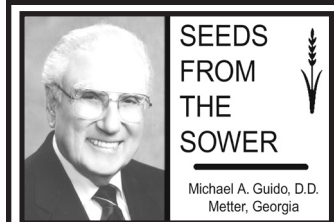

At many railroad crossings this sign was nearly always plainly displayed. It was simply a device of warning all who approached of the dangers that were always present. The reason for such a sign was to notify the passerby that one could never be sure if a highball train was coming, because a schedule was not posted.

Now, if we compared this to a scriptural connotation, surely we can see a relationship between such a sign and the Bible. **First of all**, every one of us is just travelers upon this earth for a certain space of time. In **Isaiah 89:47-48**, "Remember how short my time is; wherefore hast thou made all men in vain? What man is he that liveth and shall not see death? Shall he deliver his soul from the hand of the grave?" Also in **Psalms 90:10**, "The days of our years are three score years and ten" (70).
