
Madalene Wasson now has another book out about her family.



# Stop - Look - Listen

At many railroad crossings this sign was nearly always plainly displayed. It was simply a device of warning all who approached of the dangers that were always present. The reason for such a sign was to notify the passerby that one could never be sure if a highball train was coming, because a schedule was not posted.

Now, if we compared this to a scriptural connotaion, surely we can see a relationship between such a sign and the Bible. First of all, every one of us is just travelers upon this earth for a certain space of time. In **Isaiah** 89:47-48, "Remember how short my time is; wherefore hast thou made all men in vain? What man is he that liveth and shall not see death? Shall he deliver his soul from the hand of the grave?" Also in **Psalm 90:10**, "The days of our years are three score years and ten" (70). Even today with all of mankind's medical knowledge, the average age when death comes is only 74 years. This should be very frightening unto anyone who thinks that they will automatically live to an advanced old age. It just is not the norm! So why not take this advice from the Bible and just **stop** long enough to face reality and make an effort to face the inevitable?

Then we need to look onto the pages of God's book to see if I speak the truth. Sadly, most of the folks that I have a conversation with concerning the Bible really know very little about it. This is sad. Perhaps the most important book in this world is the most neglected. Our look at God's word should reach much farther than the superficial. And he that sent me is with me. The father had not left me alone; for I do always those things that please him."
