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

## IPD recovers stolen guns

This includes Michael A. Eversole, 52, Robert R. Tipton Jr., 45, Justin Mosley, 21, and William Kristopher Bray, 34.

Eversole and Tipton were arrested October 23 on drug trafficking charges. Mosley and Bray were arrested October 25 for promoting contraband into the Estill Detention Center for unrelated incidents. All four defendants pleaded not-guilty during their arraignments in Estill District

Judge Leach explained to all the defendants who waived their cases to the grand jury that if the grand jury does not indict them within 60 days they will be discharged from jail.

Police Chief Brad Smith said that a burglary attempt was made at the Children's Clinic on River Drive early Thursday morning. He stated that someone had tried to enter the business by kicking the door in.

Smith believes the intended burglar may have run off when the burglar alarm ran off. He added that Officer John Sturniolo was at the scene within a few minutes of the alarm drop.

The police chief recommends that all residents keep on the lookout for any suspicious activity during the odd hours, such as early morning.

Hurst also pleaded not-guilty to the possession charge in Estill District Court on Friday. A pre-trial conference on that charge has been set for November 13 in Estill


Puckett was already in the Estill County Detention Center when IPD served the new warrant on him on

Puckett was indicted October 24 and incarcerated by IPD on the indictment warrant on October 26. The indictment warrant charges Puckett with cultivating in marijuana (5 plants or more), possession of marijuana, attempt to traffic in legend drugs, drug paraphernalia, and persistent felony offender second degree.

Puckett pleaded not guilty to his latest charge during an arraignment in Estill District Court on Friday. His preliminary hearing will be held in Lee County next
