Aprons were not only dress protectors but served many other purposes. They wiped away tears and noses; eggs, tomatoes and blackberries were even picked in them. They were used many times when breaking beans or shelling peas to catch the strings. In hot kitchens they were used to wipe away sweat, and to handle pots and pans.

Later on when Mom wore slacks instead of dresses she didn't wear aprons as much; I suppose the style changed when women stopped wearing dresses everyday. Myself, I like to wear an apron even with jeans. I am messy when I cook so I usually wear a full apron, one resembling a butcher's apron except it is blue.

I remember my favorite one of my Mom's aprons; it was red organdy with lace that she always wore when cooking Christmas dinner; it is very special to me; it brings back a lot of memories from Christmases past.

My collections of aprons consist of gingham aprons, red, blue and orange checked ones, a white organdy trimmed in poinsettias for Christmas, terry cloths ones, and green and black calicos.

Of all the collections, two are very special to me. They are quilted, full aprons that tie at the neck. One has a winter scene with a big snowman on the front with snow in the back ground.

The other one is red, green and white with Christmas decorations and characters with snow on it. These were made by a special friend of mine that I went to church

with several years ago. She made one of these aprons every year to give for our Sunday School Christmas party at church.

We always played "Dirty Santa," the game where you steal each other's gifts that you'd rather have, and when the time is up you have to keep the gift you have. Well, I was lucky enough two years to receive the two beautiful aprons that were handmade by Angie Brandenburg. She is a wonderful lady and always hosted our Sunday school class party. She was a great cook and her Italian lasagna was awesome.

She lives in Elizabethtown now and recently lost her husband, Russell, a few months back. We miss both of them at church and all the work and ministering they did in our church. They are fine people.

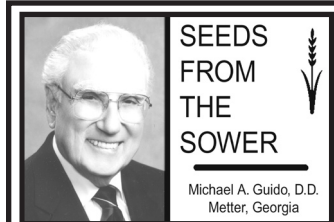

## Are We Watching?

The definition of the word watching is a simple one. It means to be looking for, also to be expecting something. In the Holy scriptures it is used in Luke 12:37-39 as a man that is guarding his goods to prevent a thief from coming to steal them at an uncertain time. He also says if he is watchful and vigilant, he could prevent the thief from breaking in. In verse 39 of the same text our Lord uses this illustration comparing it to his second coming, saying: "Be ye therefore ready also; For the Son of man cometh at an hour when ye think not!" In Matthew 24:42-41, here is recorded the same message, but in Luke 12:46 it says that the Lord of the servant will come in a day and in an hour when he looketh not for Him.

There are many warnings given unto all mankind to prepare for the event of Christ's return, but sadly when we examine the actions of many people, even those who should know better. It seems that not many are watching and preparing themselves. Why do we reach such a conclusion?

First of all church attendance is at an all time low, except in the churches with the greater amount of recreational attendance. Only a bunch of well fed, unsaved people. What is happening to America?
