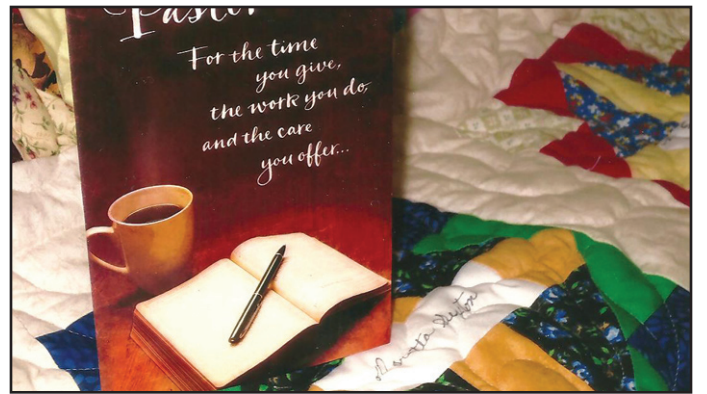
A reception followed the ceremony at The Mule Barn of Arlington Country Club in Richmond. Music provided by DJ, Todd Chaney.
