Three are hurt in 2 different wrecks

Three people were injured in two wrecks in Estill County last week.

Both drivers received injuries during a rear-end collision around 5:35 p.m. last Wednesday on the Richmond Road, seven miles west of Irvine.

According to Deputy Randy Farthing, a vehicle driven by Sherrlyn Walters of Conrad Estates was traveling west and had slowed or stopped in traffic. He added that Walters was attempting to turn left from Richmond Road into Conrad Estates.

He added that a vehicle driven by Juanita Hughes of Thomas Road was two cars behind Walters' car. He added that Hughes had merged her vehicle over to the right to go around Walters' vehicle. He stated that Hughes failed to stop and her vehicle struck Walters' in the rear.

Walters was transported by ambulance to Marcum

& Wallace Hospital, and Hughes was taken to a hospital by a private vehicle.

The deputy said both vehicles were severely damaged. Hughes 2010 Ford Fusion received front damages and Walters 2007 Buick Lacross was damaged in the rear.

One car wrecked Thursday, around 7 p.m., on the Winchester Road, and sent its driver to the hospital with injuries.

Deputy Randy Farthing said that Tammy McHodgkins of Irvine apparently fell asleep. Her 2002 Kia Sephia left the road on the right side when she was about 14 miles from Irvine.

The car struck an embankment and then struck a tree.

McHodgkins was transported to Marcum & Wallace Hospital for treatment of her injuries.

The Kia sustained severe injuries to its front.

IPD makes arrests for DUI & weapon

Two men were arrested in separate incidents by the Irvine Police Department.

Brian Brewer, 42, of Sandhill Road, Irvine was charged November 6 by Officer Mike Gross with driving under the influence and possession of marijuana.

The citation says that Officer Gross stopped Brewer to serve an active warrant on him. Upon approaching Brewer's 2004 Buick, Officer Gross said he got a strong odor of alcoholic beverages.

The officer added that Brewer failed field sobriety tests and marijuana cigarettes were found during a search.

Brewer was arraigned Friday, November 8 in Estill District Court. He pleaded not-guilty to the charges. A pre-trial conference was set for November 13.

Timothy Ray Henry, 51, of Wagersville Road, Irvine was arrested by Irvine Police Officer Jeff Knuckles early Sunday morning.

Henry was charged with alcohol intoxication, posses-

sion of drug paraphernalia first, possession of an open container in vehicle, and carrying a concealed deadly weapon.

According to court records, Henry was a passenger in a vehicle was was extremely intoxicated.

Officer Knuckles said Henry was extremely intoxicated and smelled of alcoholic beverages.

The citation states that Henry had slurred speech and needed assistance walking.

During a search of Henry's persons, Officer Knuckles said he located a syringe in the left front pocket. He stated that he also found a hunting knife in a sheath hidden in the lining of Henry's jacket.

In plain view, the officer added was a half drunk bottle of Seagrams Seven.

Bond for Henry was set at \$650 cash.

Court records say Henry was arrested while he already had a case pending.

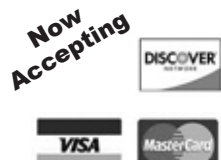
