Bread Pudding

4 eggs, beaten 2 1/4 cups milk ½ cup sugar ½ tsp cinnamon 1 tsp. vanilla 1/8 tsp nutmeg 2 cups stale bread (white) into 1-inch cubes ½ cup raisins (optional) Whipped cream (optional) to garish

In large mixing bowl use a rotary beater to beat eggs, milk, sugar, cinnamon, vanilla, and nutmeg. Set mixture aside. Place the two cups of bread crumbs in an ungreased baking dish and pour egg mixture evenly over the bread crumbs and raisins.

Bake in 350 degree oven for 40-45 minutes until tests done by inserting a knife in center comes out clean. Serve with whipped cream if desired. Yield: 6-8 servings.

Is There Any Whom Fear?

Hebrews 11:7 says: "By faith Noah, being warned of God of things not seen as yet, moved with fear, prepared an ark to the saving of his house, by the which he condemned the world, and became heir of righteousness which is by faith."

Notice that the beginning and ending of this verse speaks the same way: By faith.

The definition of this word means: a reverence of God's love, and of His power, or authority. Sadly, we have now reached the time when history is now beginning to repeat itself, for there is very little reverence for God in the world. For the same reasons God condemned and overthrew the anti-deluvian world. We are now seeing being promoted by our president, our governors, our senators, by raising the status of homosexuals and lesbians as being a normal thing. What they are doing is flying in the face of God who does not allow anyone of this lifestyle to ever enter into his heaven, unless they repent. I Corinthians 6:19 and Revelation 21:8 says that none of this lifestyle will ever enter there. God calls this an abomination.
