You wanted to know where God chose the foolishness of preaching to save them that believe. God, in His wisdom, has authorized that preaching of the Word be the means of saving sinful mankind. (Read I Corinthians 1:21)

An awesome responsibility falls on the shoulders of preachers of the gospel today!
