## Irvine woman arrested for burglary after going into home to get a child

An Irvine woman faces burglary charges after she allegedly entered a home uninvited Sunday night, according to the Irvine Police Department.

Irvine Officer Ken Rifenburg said that Vickie Sue Campbell, 40, knocked on the door at 437 N. Madison. An 11 year old child opened the door, and Rifenburg said Campbell barged in.

He added that she then broke several items including an \$800 antique lamp. From there, he said Campbell went into a bedroom and picked up her child which she no longer has custody of.

Rifenburg said the homeowner, Joyce Rawlins, intercepted and prevented Campbell from leaving with the child.

When he arrived at the scene, he said Campbell laid down in the floor and would not comply to any of his commands. He said he dragged Campbell to his cruiser with the assistance of Ravenna Police Chief Ken White.

Once outside, Rifenburg said that Campbell was yelling and cursing. She said she created a disturbance and had been asked multiple times to leave by the homeowner.

No address was given

for Campbell, who is also known as Vickie Sue Corbett.

Campbell was charged with criminal mischief second degree, burglary second degree, resisting arrest, and disorderly conduct, second degree.

She appeared in Estill District Court on Monday. Her bond has been set at \$20,000 cash.

Campbell pleaded not guilty to all four charges during her arraignment. District Judge William "Bo" Leach set December 11 as the date for Campbell's preliminary hearing.

## 6 are injured Sunday in wreck

Six people were injured Sunday afternoon in a rear-end collision on Driftwood Drive, about six miles east of Irvine.

According to Deputy Randy Farthing, Elijah Begley of Sandhill Road had slowed down or stopped in the road in his 2004 Dodge Nissan.

Jeffrey Gross of Barnes

Mountain Road came over a rise in the road in his 2002 Volkswagen Passat. He noticed that Begley's vehicle was in the road. Deputy Farthing said that Gross was unable to stop and his vehicle struck Begley's in the rear.

The impact caused Begley's car to go off the road on the right side.

Gross and his two passengers were transported to Marcum & Wallace Memorial Hospital. The passengers were identified as Logan Reed and Bradley Young.

Begley also had two passengers in his vehicle, Pamela Begley and Tim Henry.
