

Flynn Becomes All-Time Estill Girls Points Leader

The home folks were excited about the Estill Lady Engineers' matchup with Berea on Monday night in anticipation that junior guard Kennedy Flynn would score at least 25 points and break the Lady Engineers' all-time scoring record held by former Lady Engineer Jessica Puckett.

However, the teams gave fans more than they bargained for with an exciting overtime game after Estill

came from behind by fouling to tie the game, then win in extra periods by 2, 66-63.

The two teams traded leads early, but later in the game through the third quarter, Estill kept slightly ahead of Berea.

True to form, Flynn scored two points to give Estill a 49-42 lead, and after a timeout, the junior Lady Engineer was called to the floor and awarded the game

ball at 5:17 after breaking Puckett's scoring record.

Afterwards, the Lady Engineers seemed to slow up a bit, and Berea overtook them and held the lead as time ran out.

Estill was behind by four points with 22.1 seconds to go but Flynn went 2-2 at the line to pull within two. Berea then went back up by 4 again, 60-56, with 15.5 seconds to go on their trip to the charity stripe.

But Flynn made the game interesting at 10.4 seconds with a three that cut the Berea lead to one. They hit only one of two after being fouled to go up by two, 61-59, and Estill got the ball back with 6.5 seconds to go. Flynn drove the floor toward the basket and all eyes were on her to make the shot and nearly all of the Berea defenders were guarding her. But the talented guard made a slick pass across the lane

from near the top of the key to sophomore Sarah Barnes who was under the basket and dropped in two to tie.

The Lady Engineers took control in the OT period and picked up their second win of the young season to go 2-2 by a score of 66-63.

Flynn scored 37 points in the game and now is all-time Estill girls leader with 1703 points. She hit nine twos, four threes and was 7/12 at the line.

Estill has won over Model 63-53 and lost to Lee County, 60-50, and Lexington Christian, 61-49.

Bethany Hall hit 16 in the Estill win.

Estill's boys lost their opener to Hazard at home, 71-47, beat Lee County at home, 69-48, and lost at Montgomery County in the Bart Rison Classic to South Laurel, 63-43.
