Taylor said the contractor will remove 30,000 cubic yards of slate rock and place it in the county park area. Then the slate rock will be covered with three feet of clay.

The judge said there is enough clay at the county park for this project. The contractor will reimburse the county for the use of the clay.

Taylor recognized three county employees who had retired.

Roy Fowler had retired after 20 years, 18 of them as dog warden.

"Roy did the job when it was a hard job," Taylor stated.

"I was the first dog warden when the (animal shelter) started in Estill County at the landfill," Fowler said.

Sandra Clark had retired from the shelter after eight years. She had started there with the Experienced Works program. When Fowler transferred from the shelter, she was acting director for two years.

David Jenkins retired from the county road department with 20 years of experience.

"It's good to have employees who stick with us through the many years," the judge stated.

One bid was opened for construction of

the radio tower. It was from the same company who had constructed two other towers in the county.

The bid was approved contingent upon it meeting the CSEPP specifications.

The court entered into an agreement with Ravenna to remove snow and ice.

Taylor said Ravenna has salt, a salt spreader and plow and will compensate the county for man power.

After Ravenna's streets are cleared, the truck can be used on county roads.

Calendar year budgets were accepted from the water district, county clerk, and sheriff.

A salary cap of \$200,000 was accepted for the county clerk's staff, and \$215,000 for the sheriff's staff.

Taylor announced that a program with West Care has saved the county over \$18,000 in incarceration costs during the month of November.

"It's working and other counties are starting to look and see if it will work for them too," Taylor said.

"You're not going to have a success with every person you put in it," said Davis.

Tom Mullen, animal control officer, said proceeds from a benefit fundraiser will be used to purchase needed items at the shelter, including dog traps and dart guns.
