Our Merciful God

In **Psalm 103:8-10**, David wrote: "The Lord is merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and plenteous in mercy. He will not always punish, neither will he keep his anger forever. He hath not dealt with us after our sins; nor rewarded us according to our iniquities."

The definition of merciful reveals the very character and nature of God: "compassion, pity, and loving kindness." These are the attributes of our God. Did you ever wonder why that drunkards, unbelievers, atheists, immoral, and a host of other things that men commit, why do they seem to live their long lives? It is because we all are living under the hand of a loving God. Paul said in **Ephesians 2:4-5**, "But God who is rich in mercy, for his great love, wherewith he loved us, even when we were dead in sins." He went on to write in **Titus 3:4-5**, "But after the kindness and love of God our Saviour toward man appeared, not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his own mercy he saved us." Peter wrote in **II Peter 3:9**, "The Lord is not slack concerning his promise, (Here he is speaking about his return to judgment) as some men count slackness: but is long suffering to us-word, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance." This may be the real fact that is preventing the Lord's return at this very moment. He loves the sinful unbeliever, the immoralist, the drunkard, the drug sellers, the drug users, the fornicators, the list continues, but by now we surely must surely get the message.
