Man arrested after chase and charged with a theft

The deputy said he turned off his lights and ended the pursuit because it was dangerous to the public.

Farthing stated that he turned around and went back to recover the stolen pipe. After the pipe was taken back to Sand Hiill, Farthing said he went to Pea Ridge to locate the driver of the truck.

As Farthing was headed east on Pea Ridge Road, he said he observed the truck traveling west. He stated that he turned on his lights and pulled into the truck's lane

of travel to stop the truck.

Farthing stated the driver attempted to pull away from him to avoid an arrest. He said he pepper sprayed the driver and took him to the ground to place hand cuffs on him.

The truck's driver was identified as Joseph Dudley Willis, 24, of Sand Hill Road, Irvine. Willis was charged with theft by unlawful taking or disposition under \$500, fleeing or evading police, first degree (motor vehicle), wanton endangerment, first degree, operating on a suspended or revoked

license, and resisting arrest.

Willis was arraigned in Estill District Court on Monday, February 10. He pleaded not-guilty to all five charges.

Judge William "Bo" Leach scheduled a preliminary hearing for Willis on February 19.

According to court records, Willis was arrested on a new offense while he has a charge pending. Willis was out on a bail posted by his mother, Lisa Willis. Bail for his latest charge is \$50,000, and the court says his mother cannot post the bond this time.

Irvine woman arrested on warrant for endangering child in Madison

An Irvine woman has been arrested for wanton endangerment of her child.

Irvine Police Officer Karl Rifenkark served an arrest warrant from Madison County on Natasha Rogers, 26, of Sweet Lick, Road, Irvine on Thursday, February 7.

The warrant says that on January 11, 2014, Rogers was under the influence of a controlled substance. It adds

that she endangered the safety of her 18-month-old child by allowing an unlicensed intoxicated driver to operate her vehicle.

The police officer obtaining the warrant, Zachary Stokes, said he was flagged down by several people concerning the vehicle in which Rogers was a passenger. The driver was charged with driving under the influence and not having a valid driv-

ers license.

Rogers is the owner of the vehicle in which her child was found in the back seat, the warrant says.

During the traffic stop, there was a belief that Rogers was suffering a seizure at the scene. She was transported to Baptist Health Emergency Room. The warrant states that she admitted to the staff that she had taken suboxone.

Local Police Activity

Burglary

Thousands of dollars worth of tools were stolen from a home at Pryse on February 3. The theft occurred in a vacant house which was owned and being renovated by Wallace Taylor. The house was locked, but someone entered it illegally through a window.

The stolen items included tools valued at \$2,573. They included a drill, sawzall with battery, 12-inch planer, 6 foot step ladder, 50 feet spool of orange wire, 20 various breakers to an electric box, palm sander, three electric heaters, and a box of dishes.

Deputy Josh Rison is investigating.

Check Forgery

Anthony Addison of Reece Street, Irvine reported criminal possession of a forged instrument and forgery, both in the second degree to Deputy Rison on February 3.

Addison told the deputy that several checks had been stolen from his residence. A known female had cashed one of Addison's checks at Dollar Deals in West Irvine. An arrest is pending.

Arrests Made

Kenia Thompson of South Irvine Road, Irvine, was charged with promoting contraband first degree. Thompson was arrested on an Estill County warrant and was lodged in the jail on February 3.

A deputy sheriff's report says that Thompson was searched at the jail by a deputy jailer who found two unopened suboxone strips and a plastic bag full of tobacco.

Glenna Shean, 42, of

White Oak Road, Irvine, was arrested February 6 by Irvine Police Officer Karl Rifenkark on a warrant. She is charged with cruelty to animals second degree. The warrant was obtained by Rifenkark. It states that on January 19, 2014, Shean mistreated a female dog and six puppies by failing to provide adequate food, drink water, space, and health care. The warrant adds that all the dogs were very malnourished and were living in a small outbuilding which was full of trash.

An Irvine woman was cited for obstruction or interference with a police offi-

cer. Officer John Sturniolo went to 217 Hood Avenue on February 8 looking for a subject.

He said that Annette M. Moore told him the subject he was looking for was not in her home. Sturniolo said the man was hiding in Moore's closet.

Moore is scheduled to answer the charge on March 19 in Estill District Court.

A bench warrant was served on Brandon W. Rice, 30, of Fike Road in Waco on February 8 by Officer Sturniolo. The bench warrant was for a probation violation.

Hinds pleaded not-guilty to the three charges. He will return to district court for a preliminary hearing on February 19.

Bond for Hinds was set at \$10,000 cash. Court records say he was arrested on a new offense while a case against him was pending.

McKinney and Combs were arraigned Friday, February 7 in Estill District Court.

Both of them pleaded not-guilty to unlawful transaction with a minor - second degree and endangering the welfare of a minor.

They will return to court on February 12 for preliminary hearings.
