I had the privilege of hearing Ken Hamm, the creator of the Creation Museum, located in Covington, Ky. He was debating a fellow named Bill Nye, a well-known professor who teaches against the creation account of the Bible. While both men gave a good record of their knowledge regarding the topic, it seems that even without saying it that Mr. Hamm revealed in his delivery that his beliefs were based upon faith in the scriptures and are totally justified by archeological discoveries. At the same time, Mr. Nye turned to fossil discoveries hoping to prove that the earth is perhaps millions of years old, isntead of six thousand which is plainly taught by the

While they were making their case, I kept thinking this: if Mr. Hamm is right, then he has something to hang onto at death, and at the same time I ask: what will Mr. Nye have at death? By his own words he said that man like an animal just ceases to exist at death and that is all there is to life as we know it.

While there may be many more who may believe as does Mr. Nye, where does this place all the unbelievers in this world? While the Bible plainly teaches that after death there will be a judgment day (Hebrews 9:27), Mr. Nye refuses this teaching.
