





ABC to determine 2 of 3 to get quota liquor licenses

Irvine Police Chief Brad Smith updated the Irvine City Council about applications for the two quota liquor licenses in Irvine.

Smith said three people had applied for the two quota licenses during the 30 day open application process. They were Montie Brock and Wesley Morgan, both of Richmond, and James Johnson of Irvine.

The police chief, who will serve as the city's alcohol license administrator, said the three licenses have been sent to the state ABC in Frankfort for review. He said no applications have yet been

approved at the state level. More investigations are required before licenses are issued. Smith said the Sonja Semones, director
