

March has been designated as Severe Weather Preparedness Month in Estill County and other counties across the state and have designated this month as a time for severe weather preparedness.

We know it's hard to think about severe weather with all the snow we've had, but as the weather begins to get warmer the chance for severe weather increases. The Estill County Emergency Management Agency urges you and your family to review these safety tips as we enter the peak severe weath-

• If Driving, DO NOT THROUGH **DRIVE** FLOODED AREAS! Even if it looks shallow enough to cross. The majority of deaths due to flooding are due knees. Do not lie flat! to people driving through flooded areas. Water only or other tall objects, bodies one foot deep and displace 1500 pounds! Two feet of water can easily carry most vehicles. Roadways concealed by floodwaters may

• If caught outside, go to higher ground immediately! Avoid small rivers or streams, low spots, culverts, or ravines. Do not try to walk through flowing water more than ankle deep, as it only knock you off your feet. Do not allow children to play around streams, drainage ditches, or viaducts, storm drains, or other flooded ar-

• If ordered to evacuate

Lightning is the number two storm related killer. biles. In Kentucky, more people are killed by lightning in an average year than tornadoes. Although severe thunderstorm warnings are in an underpass. NOT issued for lightning, you should move to shelter a vehicle, lie flat in a nearwhen thunder is heard as by ditch or depression and lightning can strike 10 to 15 cover your head with your
