

Irvine council is updated on EDA's radio program and different Estill trails

Estill Development Alliance is doing a new radio program, EDA's director Joe Crawford told the Irvine Council on Monday during his quarterly update.

Crawford said the radio show is called "Come on Home," which airs Monday 11-1 on WSKV, which has a tower on Furnace Mtn.

Crawford said the program has spotlighted River City Players and the hospital. On St. Patrick's day, Zack Barnett played the bag pipes.

He added the LEAP participants had visited Frankfort recently. In April, they will be in Irvine and visit Carhartt, the hospital and Fitchburg Furnace.

He also said the EDA board of directors are giving

themselves new responsibilities. He thanked Councilman Tobo Bryant for attending EDA meetings.

Crawford talked about Irvine becoming a trail town. He said it's not just about the river trail. He added that it will include ATV users, bicyclists, hikers, horse riders, etc.

Councilman Tim Burkhardt said he was in Knott County recently for a ball game and that county had a lot of trail information. Councilman Nelle Williams then pulled one of Knott County's brochures from her purse.

They said the Knott County sports-plex was on thousands of acres of reclaimed strip mine land. It has five ball goals and a weight room.

The council asked about the five counties involved in an ATV trail which will include Patsey in Estill County.

"It's not readily accessible from Irvine," Crawford stated.

He added they are looking at some ways to make the property accessible.

Mayor Ernest Farmer said the city needs two or three people to serve on its planning and zoning board. Anyone interested in serving should contact the mayor or a council person.

City attorney Rodney Davis updated the council about the church on Church Street. Some properties, including one owned by the city, on High Street were discussed for demolition also.

Arrested on Warrant

A South Irvine man has been arrested for allegedly making false statements to obtain unemployment benefits.

Larry Gene Thompson Jr., 34, of South Irvine Road was arrested Wednesday, March 19 on a warrant obtained by Emma Wireman, an investigator with the Kentucky Division of Unemployment.

The warrant states that Thompson received unemployment benefits from June 12, 2010 through October 16, 2010 while he was working for Express Employment.

The warrant adds that Thompson owes \$4,692.20 to the Kentucky Division of Unemployment.

Making a false statement to prevent the reduction of benefits is a Class D felony. It is punishable by fine and one to five years in prison.

Thompson was released

on March 19 on a \$5,000 surety bond. He has a court date of April 9.

Arrested for Burglary

A Sandhill woman has been charged with the burglary of her neighbor's home.

Billie Ray Wilson, 31, of 665 Sandhill Road, Irvine, was arrested for second degree burglary on Thursday night.

Wilson's neighbor at 655 Sandhill, who was not identified, told Deputy Josh Rison that he came home and Wilson was in his home unlawfully.

The deputy stated that several items had been gone through, but nothing appeared to have been taken.

Wilson's bond has been set at \$20,000 cash.

Rison was assisted in the burglary investigation by Trooper T. Robinson.

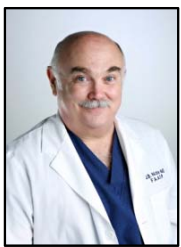
