Two young children wander the streets while parents sleep

Two young children were found wandering the streets of Irvine, Saturday afternoon. Two adults were arrested after Irvine Police conducted an investigation.

Irvine Officer John Sturniolo was called around 4:30 p.m. to 183 Broadway to the Emergency Services Building after a man and woman found the three year old boy and ten month old girl wandering in the street.

The officer said the air temperature was 43 degrees F, and it was raining when the children were found.

He stated the children were transported to Marcum & Wallace Memorial Hospital for observation.

The officer said he located the parents in an apartment at 167 Broadway. He stated both of them were sleeping and were unaware the children were missing.

Sturniolo said the apartment was filthy. Social Services were notified.

He charged Joshua Mathew Cobble, 27, and Iris Brook, 25, with wanton endangerment, first degree. The citation listed their address as 620 Henry White Road, Irvine.

Officer Sturniolo said that Brook admitted to beating her son about his face, head, and body with her hands. The citation states the wounds caused bleeding and bruising.

The citation adds that Brook admitted striking the son between 15 and 20 times on different occasions.

Brook was charged with criminal abuse in the first degree.

A citation states that Cobble was aware that his girlfriend had been beating her son about the head and body with her hands to a point she had no control of stopping. It adds that Cobble failed to report the abuse to authorities.

Cobble was charged with second degree criminal abuse.

Bail for Brook has been set at \$10,000 cash, and Cobble's bail is \$7,500 cash.

They were arraigned Monday in Estill District Court and pleaded not-guilty to the charges. Their next court appearance is April 2 for a preliminary hearing.

Police Chief Brad Smith and Captain Adrian McKinney assisted with the investigation.

Couple is charged with theft of oil producing equipment

A husband and wife have been charged with stealing nearly \$40,000 in oil producing equipment.

The arrest was made March 25, 2014 following an investigation by KSP Trooper J. Carpenter.

The citation states the Trooper was dispatched to 2700 Furnace Jct. Road in reference to a building on the property which had several items stolen from it. It adds the property owner showed the trooper several large, antique oil pumps which had been taken apart for scrap metal. He added five engines

had been stripped down.

Eight hundred feet of pipe and 1000 feet of wiring were also reported stolen. The estimated total of the stolen items is \$38,100. Estimated damages to the machines is \$29,500.

Trooper Carpenter said there was a sign stating no trespassing.

He added the owners located some of the stolen items at Freedom Metals in Winchester.

The trooper was able to obtain a picture ID and a vehicle description.

He contacted a deputy

sheriff in Powell County who located Brian Keith Brewer, 42, of Black Creek Road, Clay City and Amanda Jo Brewer, 30, of Boone Street, Stanton.

The citation states the Brewers admitted to taking the items over a two-week period. They said some guy named Jesse had told them they could take the stuff.

Both were charged with third degree burglary, first degree criminal mischief, and third degree criminal trespassing. They were lodged in the Estill County Detention Center.

4 indicted for separate break-ins

Four individuals were indicted in four separate burglaries by the Estill Grand Jury on Friday. Nine other individuals were indicted on various charges.

Lanzrea "Lonzy" Boulard, 25, of Van Nuys, California, was indicted for first degree burglary. The indictment says that on February 5, 2014, Boulard unlawfully entered a building in Estill County. It adds that he also caused physical injury to Brock Watkins. The investigation was conducted by KSP Trooper Jesse Armstrong.

James Franklin Brantley, 38, of 6th Street, Ravenna was indicted for burglary first, theft by unlawful taking/disposition, and possession of a controlled substance, 3rd - alprazolam.

According to the indictment, Brantley broke into AJETS General Store on February 14, 2014. The indictment adds that several items stolen from the Gen-

eral Store were found in Brantley's possession. Irvine Officer Karl Rifenburg was the lead investigator.

Cassandra Toler, 26, of Sandhill Church Road, Irvine, was indicted for second degree burglary. The indictment says that on July 25, 2013, she broke into a dwelling belonging to Warren Toler Jr. with the intent to commit a crime.

Deputy Randy Farthing conducted that investigation.

Coy Gregory, 35, of Gregory Lane, Irvine, was indicted for second degree burglary, fourth degree assault, kidnapping - adult, terroristic threatening 3rd, and four counts of violation of a Kentucky EPO/DVO.

The indictment states that Coy unlawfully entered the home of Teri Gregory on March 9, 2014. He allegedly caused physical injury, restrained and threatened to kill her.

The indictment states that Coy violated an EPO/DVO when he broke into Ms. Gregory's home and called her on three occasions on March 9, 2014.

Scott Camden, 41, of Short Street, Irvine was named in an indictment, charging him with first degree assault. The indictment says that Camden caused serious physical injury to Christian Hobbs on February 11, 2014.

Irvine Sgt. Michael Gross was the investigating officer.

Orville Eugene Puckett, 44, of N. Plum Street, Irvine,

was indicted for trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree, possession of a controlled substance, both 1st and third degrees, tampering with physical evidence, and drug paraphernalia.
