Irvine Police Activity Report

Christy M. Henry, 28, of Irvine was arrested Friday, March 28 by IPD Officer John Sturniolo with public intoxication, disorderly conduct second, possession of drug paraphernalia, and promoting contraband.

Officer John Sturniolo said that Henry was passed out and falling out of her chair in the lobby of Estill Clinic. He said that Henry failed field sobriety tests and became loud and aggressive in the jail parking lot. She had two syringes and 11 suboxone strips in her purse as she

entered the jail. During her arraignment on March 31, Henry pleaded not-guilty.

Captain Adrian McKinney charged Adam T. Neal, 41, of Cow Creek Road, Ravenna with public intoxication on the same date and time.

The citation states that Neal was at the Estill Medical Clinic and had been hostile toward the staff. The staff added that Neal was passed out in the waiting room and was causing alarm to staff. McKinney said he administered field sobriety tests, and Neal failed them.

Louis Woosley, 56, of 527 Laurel Street was arrested March 28 by Officer Sturniolo at his residence. Woosley was charged with disorderly conduct and alcohol intoxication.

Lewis F. Woosley, 56, of 527 Laurel Street was arrested March 31 by Captain Adrian McKinney with alcohol intoxication and contempt of court/legal slander/restraining order. The citation states that Woosley went to pre-trial services to sign up for MCR while intoxicated.

Janet Woosley, 60, of 232 Rosebud, Irvine, was charged March 28 with operating motor vehicle under the influence of drugs and one brake light. Arresting officer was Sturniolo.

Susan J. Freeman, 42, of Stevens Ave., Irvine was arrested March 30 for driving under the influence of drugs by Officer Sturniolo.

Justus Begley, 33, of Mt. Sterling, was arrested March 31 by Sgt. Mike Gross and charged with leaving a wreck, criminal mischief, endangering welfare of minor, and failing to report accident.

The wrecked car had hit a telephone pole. Sgt. Gross said that Begley's son was a passenger in the car, and Begley left the scene without seeking medical attention for himself or his son.

Gross also served a bench warrant on Begley. A charge of theft by deception including cold checks was dismissed in 2012, but Begley had reportedly failed to pay costs of \$163. The warrant was signed by Estill District Judge Bo Leach.

Reed to demonstrate basketmaking

On Saturday, April 5, Robin Reed, of Irvine, will demonstrate bark baskets from 10:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at the Kentucky Artisan Center at Berea.

A self-taught artisan, Reed keeps this tradition alive by creating baskets from the bark he harvests from willow and poplar trees growing along the banks of the Kentucky River and its tributaries, near his rural Estill County home.

Reed prefers using poplar and willow trees because they contain a large amount of sap, the presence of which is necessary to separate a tree's bark from

the inner wood.

Bark baskets by Reed are regularly available at the Kentucky Artisan Center at Berea, 200 Artisan Way, just off Interstate 75 at Berea, Exit 77. The center's exhibits, shopping and travel information areas are open daily, year-round, from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m., with the cafe open from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Admission is free.

The center currently features works by more than 700 artisans from more than 100 counties across the Commonwealth. A gallery exhibit, "Repurposed & Recycled: Works by Kentucky Artisans," is on display through Sept. 6.
