

4 indicted for separate break-ins

The indictment says that on January 31, 2014, Puckett sold two oxycodone to a co-operating witness. It adds that he had seven oxycodone and two Alprazolam in his possession.

Puckett allegedly had a loaded needle and spoon in his possession, both containing suspected, diluted oxycodone. He allegedly threw a needle and syringe, attempting to hide them.

Officer Rifembark conducted the investigation.

An indictment charged Benny Lee Baker Jr., 39, of Locomotive Street, Irvine with theft of property lost/mislaid/delivered by mistake and fraudulent use of a credit card over \$500.

According to the indictment, Baker failed to restore a lost credit card belonging to Beulah Moore on October 14, 2013. It adds that he unlawfully used the debit card for his personal gain.

The investigation was conducted by Officer Rifembark.

China Sky Combs, 30, of Lexington was indicted for promoting contraband, first, drug paraphernalia buy-possess, and tampering with physical evidence.

The indictment says on February 7, 2014, Combs attempted to introduce dangerous contraband into a detention facility. It adds that on the same date she had a used needle and crack pipe in her possession and swallowed contraband while being booked at the jail.

Combs was also indicted for being a second degree persistent felony offender. The indictment states she has been convicted of one prior felony.

The investigation was conducted by Irvine Chief of Police Brad Smith.

Cynthia Henry Puckett, 30, of Oak Street, Irvine was indicted for theft of identity of another without consent, attempt/obtain controlled substance by fraud/false state-

ment forgery, and six counts of forgery third degree.

The indictment says on January 21, 2014, Puckett used identify information of Alicia Riddell and attempted to obtain a prescription for a controlled substance using false information.

It adds that on the same date, Puckett falsely completed six written instruments with the intent to defraud Alicia Riddell.

KSP Detective Doug Cole conducted the investigation.

William E. "Billy" Neal, 25, of White Oak Road, Irvine, was indicted for three counts of theft by failure to make required disposition of property.

The indictment says that on December 5, 2013, Neal received a money gram for \$1,500 from Paul Mattingly for merchandise he had sold online that he did not own.

Then on November 30, 2013, Neal allegedly received payments totalling \$3,637.52 from PayPal for merchandise he had sold online but did not own.

On October 30, 2013, the indictment says Neal received a Western Union Money Gram for \$352 from Andrew Haselton for merchandise sold online that Neal did not own.

KSP Detective Brian Bowman conducted the investigation.

An indictment charged Wayne Scott Cornett, 46, of N. Madison, Irvine with first degree assault and being a second degree persistent

felony offender.

According to the indictment, Cornett caused serious physical injury to Vicky Cornett on February 6, 2014. The indictment says that Cornett has previously been convicted of a felony.

Irvine Officer John Sturiniolo conducted the investigation.

Abraham Jeremiah Martin, 36, of Vinemont, Alabama, was indicted for alcohol intoxication, two counts of assault, third degree of a police officer or probation officer, and menacing.

The indictment states on March 1, 2014, the defendant kicked the investigating officer, Deputy Randy Farthing in the knee and punched Deputy Jailer Price.

The menacing charge resulted from Martin allegedly placing other people in apprehension of imminent physical injury by charging law enforcement with clinched fists.

Joseph Willis, 24, of Sandhill Road, Irvine was indicted for theft by failure to make required disposition of property.

The indictment says that Willis sold a gun on November 7, 2013 to Dan's Discount Jewelry that he had borrowed from Russell Morris Jr.

Deputy Farthing conducted the investigation.

An indictment is merely an accusation. A person remains innocent until convicted in a court of law.

The Kruzers Car Show will be at the corner of Main St. and Mack St., Irvine.

The Pancake Breakfast will be at the Masonic Lodge, 221 Broadway & Lily Ave., Irvine.

The Student Art Show and Photography Display will be at the Horizon Adult Daycare, 178 Broadway, Irvine.

The Antique Gas Engine & Tractor Show will be at the Estill County Fairgrounds, 38 South Irvine Rd., Irvine.

The Kentucky River Paddle Event will be under the Irvine bridge.

The winning student Poster Contest entries will be posted at BB&T, 119 Broadway.

Description: The Mountain Mushroom Festival is a celebration of the Appalachian culture: the morel mushroom, KY agate (state rock of Kentucky), arts and crafts, Daniel Boone National Forest, Kentucky River, and mountains. The festival's mission is to share the cultural heritage and traditions of our community and support area groups (mushroom hunters, agate hunters, local crafters, artisans, and civic organizations) and businesses to foster community pride and stimulate economic development. A local volunteer committee partners with the community to present a variety of activities and provide educational opportunities. The festival provides a weekend of free activities and entertainment for everyone.

Activities:

- Mushroom theme activities include a morel market with morels for sale brought by the local hunters. The availability is dependent on the amount that the local hunters bring to the mushroom tent. Even when a late spring or dry spell makes morels scarce, morels can be tasted after the cooking demonstrations. Other activities include prize money for most mushrooms and largest, educational panels on mushroom hunting, interviews with hunters on the narrative stage, morel mascot, natural habitat terrarium for displaying the native morel, shiitake/oyster cooking demonstrations, mushroom cook-off, shiitake log inoculation demonstrations, window decorating contest, fungus 5K & 2K run/walk, parade, student poster contest, photography contest, and sale of festival souvenirs (t-shirts, hats).

- Agate activities include agate hunts in the creeks of Estill County and a KY Agate, Gem, Mineral, and Rock Show. The show features KY agates, gems, minerals, fossils, and rock displays, black light display of fluorescent material, and vendors selling everything from agates to rocks to jewelry.

- Arts & crafts are promoted through vendor booths, heritage craft demonstrations
quilt trail display, locomotive train display, and Student Art Show.

- Heritage activities include a forest display, Kentucky River display, HistoryMobile with Civil War display from the KY Historical Society, Kentucky River Paddle Event, Estill County Historical Society Museum, Fitchburg Furnace display, and flintknapper demonstrations.

- Entertainment on the grandstand will include a school jump rope team, cloggers, gymnastics team, high school jazz band, grade school chorus, and a variety of bands.

- Other activities will include a Car Show, Antique Gas Engine & Tractor Show, health screenings, eye screenings, food court, games, paddle event on KY River, Choo Choo Express, and inflatables.

Admission to the festival is free. All events are open to the public and handicapped accessible. No pets please except for service animals.

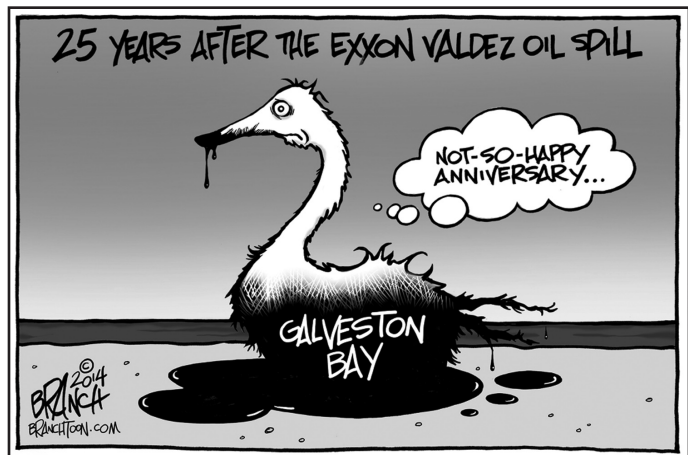
