Time To Control Crabgrass

repeating itself until the turf stand gets poorer and poorer.”
 Munshaw said the best way to control summer annual grassy weeds, including crabgrass, is to apply a pre-emergent herbicide before the weed germinates. Now is the time to do so.
 “April 15 has traditionally been the latest date to apply pre-emergent herbicides in Central Kentucky,” Munshaw said. “Western Kentucky’s deadline is usually a few days earlier, and Eastern Kentucky’s time frame usually ends a few days later.”

While spring had a cooler-than-normal start, temperatures began rebounding the week of March 31. Forsythia is a fairly reliable indicator of when crabgrass will germinate. Munshaw said forsythia in Lexington was just beginning to bud and should be in full bloom in a few days. Individuals should apply pre-emergent herbicides before the forsythia blooms begin to drop.

“Forsythia buds usually mean you have 10 to 14 days to apply a pre-emergent herbicide,” Munshaw said. “If we use this as our time frame, April 15 would once again be the deadline to shoot for to make a pre-emergent herbicide application.”
 Individuals wanting to use herbicide should look for products containing the active ingredients dithiopyr, pendimethalin, prodiamine and bensulide. “Weed and feed” products and others containing nitrogen are not recommended for lawns with cool-season grasses, such as tall fescue and Ken-

tucky bluegrass, during the spring or summer. “Nitrogen encourages the growth of perennial and annual warm-season weeds to further outcompete cool-season grasses, as they grow really well during the hottest part of the year,” Munshaw said. “All fertilizer on cool-season lawns should be applied in the fall.”

Planting Easter lilies
 Find a sunny spot in your garden, with soil pH at 6.5 to 7.0. Plant the bulb the same depth it was in the pot, and add a 2-inch layer of mulch. Lilies like sunshine, but cool soil. Cut back decaying foliage, but allow new foliage to grow. It may be 1 or 2 years before it flowers again.

USDA Sets Date for Soybean Request for Referendum

The U.S. Department of Agriculture offer soybean producers the opportunity to request a referendum on the Soybean Promotion and Research Order (Order), as authorized under the Soybean Promotion, Research, and Consumer Information Act (Act).
 The Act requires the Secretary of Agriculture to conduct a Request for Referendum every 5 years after the initial referendum, which was conducted in 1994. The last Request for Referendum was conducted in 2009. Soybean producers who are interested in having a referendum to determine whether to continue the Soybean Checkoff Program are invited to participate.
 The Request for Referendum will be conducted at USDA’s county Farm Service Agency (FSA) offices. To be eligible to participate, producers must certify and provide documentation that shows that they produced soybeans and paid an assessment on the soybeans during the period of Jan. 1, 2012, through Dec. 31, 2013.
 Beginning May 5 and continuing through May 30, 2014, producers may obtain a form by mail, fax, or in person from the FSA county offices. Forms may also be obtained via the internet at <http://www.ams.usda.gov/AMSV1.0/SoybeaninformationontheSoybeanRequestforReferendum> during the same time period. Individual producers and other producer entities may request a referendum at the county FSA office where their administrative farm records are maintained. For the producer not participating in FSA programs, the opportunity to request a referendum will be provided at the county FSA office where the producer owns or rents land. Completed forms and supporting documentation must be returned to the appropriate county FSA office by fax or in person no later than close of business May 30, 2014; or if returned by mail, must be postmarked by midnight May 30, 2014, and received in the county FSA office by close of business on June 5, 2014.
 USDA will conduct a referendum if at least 10 percent of the nation’s 569,998 soybean producers support a referendum. Not more than one-fifth of the producers who support having a referendum can be from any one State. Aquaculture/Pond Management Workshops

Aquaculture/pond management workshops coming to With more than 200,000 ponds in Kentucky, the state has many aquatic systems that need proper management. To help landowners do this, the Kentucky Cooperative Extension Service and Kentucky State University are hosting two aquaculture programs in Central Kentucky.
 An aquatic plant- and algae-control training program will take place from 10 a.m. EDT to 4 p.m. April 11 at the Franklin County office of the University of Kentucky Cooperative Extension Service.
 Forrest Wynne, William Wurts and Bob Durborow are presenters. All are KSU extension specialists for aquaculture. Discussion topics will include aquatic plant and algae identification, methods of control, and herbicide and algicide use with a special emphasis on proper chemical selection, application techniques, applicator safety and record keeping.
 Continuing education units for pesticide applicators are available including three specific hours in category 5 and two general hours in categories 10 and 12.
 Wurts, Wynne and Durborow will present a second workshop on pond management from 8:30 a.m. EDT until noon April 12 at the Franklin County Extension Office.
 “The workshop will provide a broad prospective about managing ponds for farm use and recreational fishing as well as small-scale and recreational aquaculture,” Wurts said.
 Both the workshop and training are free and open to the public. Preregistration is not required, but to ensure they receive workshop materials, potential attendees should contact Franklin Extension Service at 502-695-9035.
