Rev. Paul Arvin, 81

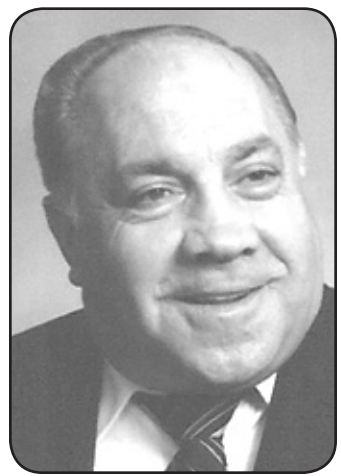

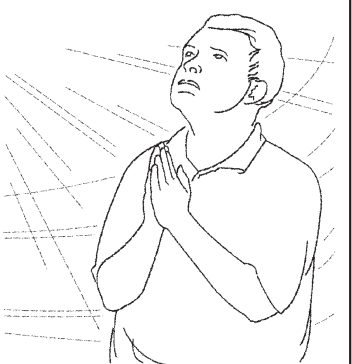
