Besides Arvin and Martin, the council said properties owned by Danny Click and Mike Tyree would be affected.

Mayor Farmer said the taxes on those four properties were less than \$800 a year.

One of the council members asked what happened a few years ago when they had a similar problem in another area of the city.

Attorney Davis said it was dropped because it wasn't worth the cost of the survey.

The mayor said he is still accepting names of people interested in serving on planning and zoning.

He also stated the city was preparing for the mushroom festival in less than two weeks.

Fire Chief Tony Murphy explained a new procedure of granting privilege licenses to the city. He asked the council to now approve privilege licenses contingent upon approval from the state fire marshal's office.

The council approved a privilege license request for Joshua Wilson and Jason Richardson to operate an auction business at the for-

mer Conrad Motors location. Murphy said that business has already been approved by the state fire marshal.

Police Chief Brad Smith said the state ABC had visited Irvine on April 3 and conducted a walk around of the three sites of possible liquor stores. Smith said a decision on the two successful applicants will probably be known next week.

Councilman Billy Arthur updated the council with quotes on repairing the front end loader.

Murphy reported his findings on the roof of a city building.

He said the roof is not as bad as it looks.

He recommended putting red tin on the building to match a nearby city building. Murphy also recommended replacing wood with vinyl which would never require painting.

He is expected to give the council a quote on the roof at their next meeting.

Councilwoman Nelle Williams proposed a top 5 project list for the council.

After the discussion, each council person agreed to bring a project to the next meet

The driver was identified as Kyle Ethan Combs, 23. Arrested were Steven Wayne Gross, 38, of South Court Street and Bradley Joe Young, 47, of Court Street. They were each charged with receiving stolen property under \$10,000, over \$500, and second degree criminal mischief.

Their citations state that both men sold 54 joint bars belonging to CSX Railroad to Cox Recycling on April 7.

On April 10, S/A William Brock of CSX and Irvine Police Chief Brad Smith went to Cox Recycling where the men were attempting to sell two more joint bars allegedly belonging to CSX.

Bond information and court dates were unavailable.

1 is hurt in wreck

A passenger was injured during a one-vehicle wreck on Highway 89 Sunday afternoon.

Crystal Durham of Church House Hill Road was driving a 98 Jeep Cherokee toward Irvine, according to Deputy Josh Rison. He reported the Jeep struck a culvert with its passenger side near South Irvine about a half-mile from Irvine.

The deputy added this event caused the driver to lose control of the vehicle. The Jeep struck an

embankment and a fence at property address 735 South Irvine Road.

The driver reportedly told the officer that she had dropped her phone and was attempting to pick it up when she struck the culvert.

The passenger, Steven McDowell, was transported to Marcum & Wallace Memorial Hospital for treatment of minor injuries.
