Once we see how much plant tissue actually dies, we can go in and remove dead twigs and branches. Give the plant a chance to recover and re-sprout. Appropriate pruning includes removal of multiple shoots allowing the strongest to grow.

The program begins Monday, April 28, 2014. If funds


permit, the program will continue through Friday, May 2, 2014; however, if funds are depleted, the program could end without further notice Due to the limited funds the program will be limited to
