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Nobody knows for sure what the extent of the home landscape plant cold injury

Landscape Cold Injury

is, since the cold conditions over the past week or so. Each site is very different from others and can vary significantly within the distance of just a few feet. Many of us have seen plants next to a house and under the eaves that appear undamaged while the same species and cultivar 10 feet away appear to have extensive cold injury. If temperatures at your site dropped to 28 degrees Fahrenheit, at least 10% of the apple, peach, plum, nectarine, blueberry, and grapes are probably lost. If the temperature dipped to 25 degrees, then a 90%

fruit kill can occur. Grapes can grow secondary buds so some crop can be expected. Of course, all injury is dependent upon the temperatures at specific locations. The best advice is to "wait and see" at this point. Plants have adapted to adversity with multiple secondary methods for remaining alive. A plant's goal in life is to reproduce as much as it can before it dies. When a terminal shoot is killed there will always be secondary and tertiary buds that will begin to grow. The first of these are the axillary buds on the previous season's growth. The next group are

latent buds (trace buds) hidden below the bark. Once we see how much plant tissue actually dies, we can go in and remove dead twigs and branches. Give the plant a chance to recover and re-sprout. Appropriate pruning includes removal of multiple shoots allowing the strongest to grow. For more information, contact the Estill County Extension Office at 723-4557. Estill has joined an agreement with Madison County to replace a bridge on Knob Lick Road. A low water bridge on Fitchburg Road will also be replaced.

The county accepted its only bid received for gravel from Hinkle Contracting.

After some discussion, an agreement was passed with Montgomery County Regional Jail. That jail will house females from Estill for \$35 a day.

Taylor asked why they should pay \$35 when another jail charges \$28.

County Attorney Rodney Davis recommended the county pass the agreement because it is not always possible to find a jail that can take a female inmate.

Susan Starling was re-appointed to serve on the Board of Health. She has been a board member for eleven and a half years.

Bills were approved for the sheriff's office for transporting prisoners to court. Mileage was \$1,094 and overtime reimbursement was \$1,860.

The magistrates voted to advertise for an employee with a CDL license and heavy equipment experience at the road department.

ment. Taylor said that one employee had resigned last Wednesday, and three more may be leaving. A bill of \$2,100 for dead animal removal was discussed. The conservation district has been paying half but will no longer pay the company because of increased costs. According to the judge, the county and conserva-

tion service are looking for another county that will dispose of dead farm animals. Taylor's opponent in the May Republican primary, Gary Powell, questioned Taylor about a few employees working on grant projects while working for the county. Powell estimated two employees had received about \$200,000 over two years on the grant projects,

which was a violation of the county's ethics code. The judge disagreed with the amount quoted by Powell, and said the employment of the worker with the county was abruptly ended when he found out. He did say the employee worked until the grant project was done. He agreed to meet the following day with Powell to discuss the allegations.

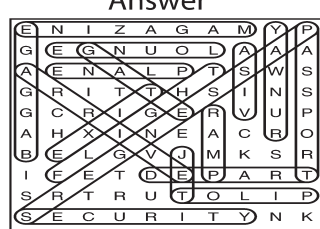

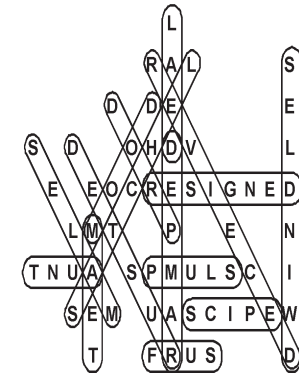

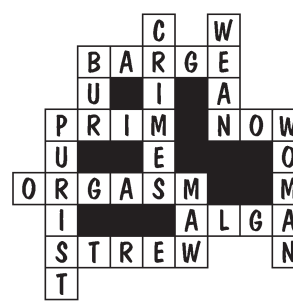
