Kiwanis Park Parade is Saturday

The Kiwanis Park baseball and softball parade will be held this Saturday, starting at about 10:00 a.m. in Irvine and travel through Irvine and Ravenna to the field.

High water from headwaters of Cow Creek and back water from the Kentucky River had forced the Ravenna Kiwanis Park Parade, originally scheduled for Saturday, May 3rd, to be postponed until Saturday, May 17th, according to park director Billy Bruce Wiseman. Also, Saturday, May 10th was "Prom Day" and would have made

it inconvenient to have the parade on that Saturday.

Games have also been rescheduled because of water covering the fields, and a schedule of the games will be available.

Games began Monday, May 12th and a full schedule of games is planned for Saturday, May 17th following the opening ceremony and an Exceptional League game.

The parade will assemble in Irvine (on Saturday, May 17th) and travel up Broadway to its destination at the ball park.
