Two democrats are running for state representative of the 91st district. They are Cluster Howard and Arch Johnson Jr. The winner will go against Republican Toby Herald in the November election.

Republican Gary Powell is seeking his party's nomination for judge/executive over incumbent Wallace C. Taylor. The winner will face democrat Jim Thacker in November.

Republicans will sit out the sheriff's race in the primary. Democrat Terry Carroll is challenging Gary Freeman for his party's nomination. The winner will face republican Ken White in November.
