My family has many teachers; my daughter and son-in-law are teachers, my niece, my late brother-inlaw, three of my aunts and several cousins were teachers. My oldest sister, Juanita "Tootsie" Rison was a teacher at one time, who taught at Granny Richardson Springs School and Gum Springs School in the late fifties and early sixties.

Tootsie was sent to teach at Gum Springs School about 1960 and taught there approximately four years. At that time there wasn't much discipline at the school and the boys had run the teacher off. Mr. Miller, the superintendent asked her to take the school and try to establish some order and discipline. She agreed to take the posi-

The school was a one room building with three windows on each side and a front and back door; exactly like all the others in the county. The building had been whitewashed; but time had faded the clapboard siding. Two rickety steps led into the shotgun building. Inside were rough, oiled floors with many splinters just waiting to hit bare feet.

In the center of the room sat a huge black pot belly stove and desks in rows along the sides of the room. Coat rooms were for hanging coats and tables held wahands.
