## Police say man assaulted dad

Police say a Wiseman town man assaulted his father last Wednesday and then fled from the home before the officers arrived.

A citation by Deputy Josh Rison says that Daniel Bowling, 42, of V.C. Witt Road, Irvine, assaulted his father. Minor injuries reportedly were inflicted upon George Bowling.

Rison said Daniel Bowling fled from him. When he told D. Bowling to stop, he said the man tried to fight him.

The citation states that after D. Bowling was taken into custody, he punched and kicked Irvine Officer John Sturniolo. It also states that he punched KSP trooper T. Robinson in the face.

Rison said that D. Bowling raised his fists at him when he took him into custody and said he was going to fight.

The citation states that D. Bowling told the three officers that he was going to kill them.

D. Bowling was charged with assault fourth degree (domestic violence, minor injury, fleeing or evading police first degree, assault third degree police/probation officer, alcohol intoxication, menacing, resisting arrest, and terroristic threatening.

Two of the charges are felonies They are the fleeing charge and assault third degree.

Bail for Bowling was set at \$20,000 cash. In an unrelated incident, a Ravenna woman now faces a felony charge after being stopped allegedly for speeding.

Irvine Officer Sturniolo wrote that he clocked on radar Jessica Turner, 32, of Poplar Street, Ravenna traveling on River Drive early last Thursday. Turner's vehicle, a 2000 Jeep, reportedly had only one brake light.

The citation states that Turner told the officer that she had been drinking earlier that day and had smoked marijuana possibly the day before.

Turner was taken to Marcum & Wallace for a blood test before she was transported to the jail. In a separate citation, Turner was charged with illegal possession of a legend drug, first.

That citation states that she had metropolol in her possession. The medicine is used for blood pressure. The medicine had been prescribed for another person.

Turner was released from custody on a \$650.00 surety bond. She will be arraigned on the charges on June 18 in Estill District Court.

Turner was taken to Marcum & Wallace for a blood test before she was transported to the jail. In a separate citation, Turner was charged with illegal possession of a legend drug, first.

That citation states that she had metropolol in her possession. The medicine is used for blood pressure. The medicine had been prescribed for another person.

Turner was released from custody on a \$650.00 surety bond. She will be arraigned on the charges on June 18 in Estill District Court.
