Several communities received storms and rain last week but no rain on Sand Hill. It rains in spots in the summer; my Dad always called it dry weather showers. He also said if locust trees bloom well you can expect a good crop, I really haven't seen any blooms this year; maybe it's because I don't have a locust tree, but if that is any indication it is going to be a dry summer.

Nowadays most farmers roll their hay; but when I was growing up we did not have that luxury; all the hay was in bales or was loose hay

that you had to handle with a pitchfork.

I will never forget the time we were hauling loose hay from the field to the barn when my sister was riding on top of the hay and when we crossed the bridge to the barn the whole load slipped into the creek with her on top of it. It was funny to me but she didn't think it was funny; thankfully she wasn't hurt.

Seeing all the hay made me remember all the times I used to go with my Dad to mow hay; it never fails to send my mind back..... I am standing on the fender beside my Dad driving a gray and red Ford tractor in the hay field. If I close my eyes I can see Dad on the tractor looking back at the mowing machine sickle to make sure it was cutting just right.

Dad cut hay in the orchards and meadows but my favorite place to cut hay was the alfalfa field. It was located on what is now the upper part of Geneva Avenue. Dad would stop the tractor and I rescued baby rabbits hidden in the alfalfa from the mowing machine.

Just having the equipment now days to cut and bale the hay is very expensive. New mowing machines go

for about \$8000.00 and balers even more. I don't see how any money is made in farming anymore; especially since the lost of tobacco as a cash crop.

Many farmers have turned to growing vast amounts of vegetables, grapes, chickens and alpacas. The wine industry in Kentucky sure has increased; wineries are advertised along the interstate with many in Madison and Fayette counties.

Farming is hard work; but it is fulfilling. You are your own boss and can work at your own pace; and you don't have a supervisor on your butt all the time. Plus it is good for you physically; I heard on the news the other day that sitting at a desk for 30 years sure takes away your length of life. I've come to the conclusion that the harder you work physically the better your health becomes.

I sat at a desk most of my career; and have terrible back trouble; but my sciatic nerve pain is a little better; I just can't lie down and sleep. Oh! well after my orthopedic appointment on the 30th I will know more about my MRI and tests.

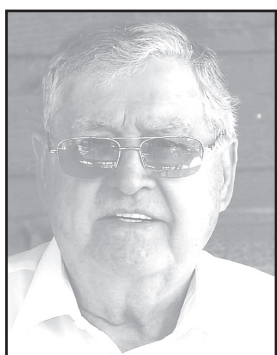

In **I John 3:1-2** it is written: "Behold what matter of love the father hath bestowed upon us, that we should be called the sons of God; therefore the world knoweth us not, because it knew him not. Beloved now we are the sons of God, and it doeth not yet appear what we shall be, but we know that when he shall appear, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is." Also in **Revelation 1:7** it says: "Behold he cometh with clouds and every eye shall see him."

Now friends there are three very important things mentioned here. First, God bestowed His great love to us in the form of Jesus Christ. Secondly, we shall see Him as He is. **Acts 1:11** guarantees it. Thirdly, on that day of His return it will matter greatly whether we have prepared, of if not prepared. Yet we will see Him. Sadly, most of our population seem to be ignoring Him as if He doesn't or did not exist. This will determine the outcome of every person on this great and awesome day.

Now, you can choose to ignore Him if you wish, and he will let you, but this will be the biggest mistake of your life. This is why Jesus came, to seek and to save the lost, but sadly if you choose not to hear Him and obey Him, you choose for yourself wrath and indignation from our Lord Himself. So why would any one do this? I believe it is simply a matter of procrastination. They know that judgment is coming, they just don't believe it will be today. So we linger and linger until it is too late. Death comes and away we go unprepared to hear Jesus say, "Well done." We pray that these short sermons will prompt you into obeying before it is too late. Friends, if you die unsaved, you will regret it forever and ever.
