caught more fish than his Daddy or Poppa Bob. He caught fourteen blue gill; they were small but they were huge to him. He was so excited. Daddy's or Poppa's need to take their kids fishing it's a great experience for them whether on pond, river or lake they will never forget their adventure.

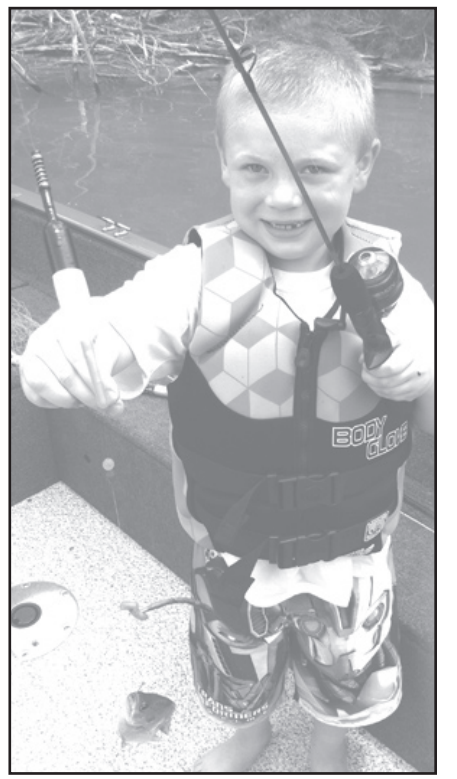

"Baptism"

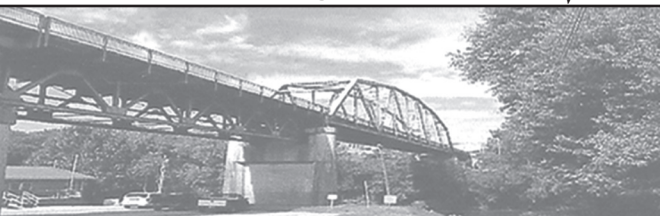
Perhaps there is no greater topic in the Bible, that has been discussed, debated, and disbelieved, and I add, more misunderstood than any other, and this is baptism in water. Most, but not all religious groups practice some form of baptism. The old saying is that baptism is no more than a sinner going into the water dry and coming up wet. But what does the Bible actually teach?

Did our Lord have a scheme of redemption that included baptism in water? If so, then when should one obey the command to be baptized? In Acts 8:26-40 there was a religious man living under the law of Moses who had never heard about the plan of redemption. Notice that the Holy Spirit guided Philip to the place where he met this Ethiopian man and was invited to ride along and explain unto him the passage found in Isaiah 63. This he did under the Holy Spirit leading him, and in so doing verse 35 says he took the same scripture and preached unto him Jesus. In Acts 20:27 Paul said to the Ephesian elders that he had not shunned to preach unto them the whole counsel of God. This is just what Philip said to the Eunuch. I know this to be true because when they arrived at the place of the palm trees, where much water was, the eunuch said, "See here is water. What does hinder me from being baptized?" Notice carefully at this one thing and that was a confession with his mouth that he believed that Jesus is the Son of God. Sadly, many religious teachers stop this point to claim salvation. But again notice that the Holy Spirit led both men down into the water in order to complete his obedience to our Lord. This he did and went on his way rejoicing. So I ask at what time should any person be baptized? The answer should be clearly understood, only after one had been truthfully taught the plan of redemption given by our Lord in Matthew 28:18-20. This person should be immediately baptized as the Philippian jailer and his household were in Acts 16:33.

Now, what is the purpose of baptism? I Peter 3:21 says that "Baptism is the answer of a good conscience toward God." Also our Lord said unto John the Baptist in Matthew 3:15 that "baptism is to fulfill or complete all righteousness." Our Lord says in Mark 16:15-18 that to believe and be baptized equals salvation. The apostles had no trouble preaching the purpose of baptism in Acts 2:38. Here under the leadership of the holy spirit, baptism was in the authority of Jesus, and that is for the remission of sins. It also said that they received the gift of eternal salvation (Ephesians 1:13-14). Now friends, much more can be said concerning the benefits of baptism but these are enough to teach and also in all whom may have been baptized, but I read the reason and purpose of this holy action. If you have any doubt about the security of your souls, just call us any time and we will meet together to more completely study about this very subject. Can I be more fair to you than this?
