

We started the goose roundup at Jacobson. The KDFWR put a remote control boat and a couple of Kayaks in the water to push geese to the bank. Then the employees of KDFWR and volunteers started pushing geese into a circle and surrounded them with highway fence, and the fun begins.

We had 270 geese rounded up and Jake was like a kid in a candy store (Goose Store)!! He started by helping carry geese to folks banding. Then he decided he wanted to get inside the fence with all the geese to catch and hand off to people outside the fence. I said earlier Jake seen this done on Dirty Jobs. It didn't Jake long to be covered in goose poop and get bit, pinched, or guess goosed by a goose. He loved every second of catching geese.




Cardinal Babies
