**Blueberry Salad** 2 cups blueberries 1 (six-ounce) package black cherry gelatin 1 cup water 1 (8 1/2 ounce) can crushed pineapple, undrained **1** small carton whipping cream 1 3-ounce) package cream cheese, softened <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup finely chopped pecans

Place one cup berries in a saucepan, cover with water and simmer until berries are tender. Drain and reserve the juice. Add enough water to the blueberry juice to make two cups. Heat juice to boiling and add gelatin, Stir until gelatin is dissolved. Add one cup cold water, pineapple, cooked blueberries, and a cup of uncooked blueberries. Pour into a 9X13 inch dish and refrigerate until firm.

Beat softened cream cheese, add nuts and fold in whipped topping. Mix well. Spread over congealed salad and chill for at least two hours before serving.

Perhaps this article will do little to offset this danger to our city and county, but I hope that it will serve as a warning unto all that might be tempted to indulge in such an activity. Sadly, the old argument that the tax upon such will be of great help to our local economy. To these people I write: "You must have your head buried in the sands of justification research," because it has been clearly noted that for every tax dollar collected from the sale of alcohol it takes seven dollars to offset the results of drinking, such as accidental death for driving drunk. 68% of all fatalities are the result of drinking. Nearly all the broken homes, sufferings of children, homelessness, and a host of other things are the end results of alcohol sales. (This is a poll submitted by US News and World Report). But this is not all we wanted to say about this blight upon society. So clearly, I want you know what our Lord says about it. In Galatians 5:21 it mentions the son of drunkeness, saying that those wo do such things shall not inherit the Kingdom of God. And Paul also wrote in **I Corinthians 6:10**. Here he includes these other things equally saying, "Nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners, shall inherit the kingdom of God."

Very sadly to note is that some who pulled the lever in favor of alcohol sales, may be claimers of professed Christianity. Here is what our Lord says about it. I Corinthians 5:11, "But now I have written unto you not to keep company, if any man that is called a brother be a fornicator, or covetous, or an idolater, or a railer, or a drunkard, or an extortioner; with such an one no not to eat." So it will be no heavens for these people, sayeth the Lord! Solomon was a very wise man. He wrote in Proverbs 20:1 "Wine is a mocker, strong drink is raging: and whosoever is deceived thereby is not wise." I could not finish without putting down a few words from the old hymn "The Great Judgment Morning." It said:

I saw the drunkard was there with his bottle, and the one who sold him his drink, along with those who issued the license, they all stood together to meet their fate.
