### Estill EMA/CSEPP & Fire Department Host BG Emergency Response Meeting

The Estill County Emergency Management Agency (EMA)/Chemical Stockpile Emergency Preparedness Program (CSEPP) and Estill County Fire Department hosted the monthly meeting for the Blue Grass Emergency Response Team (BERT) on Tuesday, July 8, 2014 at the Estill County Emergency Operations Center (EOC) on Broadway in Irvine.

Estill County is one of 11 counties that are involved with BERT. The team is made up of emergency first responders from the 11 counties. The members of the team are firefighters, EMS, emergency managers, and other experts in their fields of response.

This team is available to respond to an array of emergencies from hazmat, rescue

(high angle and low angle rope response, to trench and cave rescue, to urban search and rescue operations), natural disaster response, radiological and mass casualty incidents.

BERT positions its various resources across the region, host counties are responsible for maintaining equipment.

BERT has provided sup-

port to Estill County in the past. They supported our first responders during the gas line explosion in 2012 and the train derailment in 2007. This team is a very skilled group of first responders and a great asset to our community.
