he Jack Daniels Distillery


In early 1933, Congress was producing whiskey in Tennessee in 1866 and was the first registered distillery in the United States. Uncle Jack, a confirmed bachelor died in 1908 and upon his death the distillery went to his nephew, Lem. Prohibition took effect in Tennessee in 1910; 10 years before the 18th Amendment was passed. During prohibition Lem raised mules, ran a general store and turned Lynchburg into a center for buying

> and selling of mules. When Prohibition ended Tennessee remained "dry" and Lem was elected to a seat in the Tennessee legislature and helped pass a bill allowing the manufacture of whiskey in Tennessee, even though it couldn't be sold there.

> In 1937 Lem reopened the distillery and went out of the mule business and returned to making whiskey.

The Adolph Coors Company which had been brewing their famous beer in Golden Colorado, using Rocky Mountain water since 1873 were forced to dump 17,000 gallons of beer when the 18th Amendment was passed but the family was prepared to survive by opening a cement manufacturing facility and a porcelain factory. **Modern Day Samaritans** by BOB CASEY, Preacher

Church of Christ, 262 Broadway, Irvine, KY The Samaritans of Jesus' day were a group of people who had racially intermarried with some Jews that had escaped the War of Sargon of Assyria in 721 B.C. We can read about it in II Kings 17:21-34. Early life in Samaria was troublesome because they had not adopted a worship of God. So the King of Assyria sent some priests that were taken captive of the Jews earlier to help them select a god that would put an end to all the superstitions that were prevalent there. After a period of time which once again reintroduced the worship of Jehovah; this they claimed to have accepted, except for this historical fact. It was written that "they feared Jehovah but served their own gods as well," (II Kings 17:35). So, in the year 34 A.D., Phillip the evangelist went into Samaria and preached Christ unto them (Acts 8:1-8). But sadly even today many of them still hold to the Old Testament passover, the sacrifice of animals. They even claim the spot of worship on Mt. Gerizim is where Abraham intended to sacrifice his own son, Isaac. And that Jacob's dream (Genesis 24:10) occurred there. And on and on they go rejecting the teachings of the New Testament.
