St. Elizabeth Basement Sale

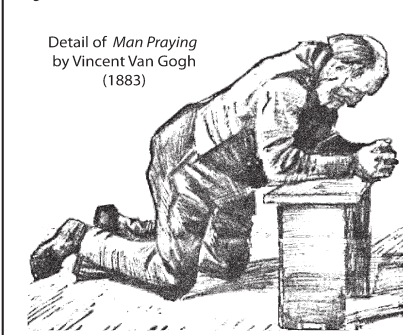

If one would yell fire in a crowded theatre, there would be a great panic, no doubt. So why is it that the bible reveals the greatest of fires that none can describe the terror of it, and most of the population completely disregards the warnings. The apostle Peter wrote extensively in **II Peter 3:7-12**, clearly stating that this present world and everything in it (elements) shall be dissolved and burned up. Folks, this passage is certainly worth reading.

In **Matthew 13:41-45**, here the fire is called a furnace. Then in **Matthew 18:8**, here the fire is called everlasting. **Matthew 24:41** is in agreement also. Then in **Mark 9:49** this fire is said to never be quenched. Paul also said in **II Thessalonians 2:6-8** calling the fire as a flaming fire. **Jude 7** calls it a vengeance of fire. Then according to **Revelation 20:10-15** Satan will be cast into a lake of fire and brimstone alongside of the false prophets to be tormented day and night forever. Then **verses 11-15**, here we have a picture of the great white throne judgment plus how and why they will be judged.
