## Estill 8U Softball All-Stars Learn To Play Ball And Develop Friendships

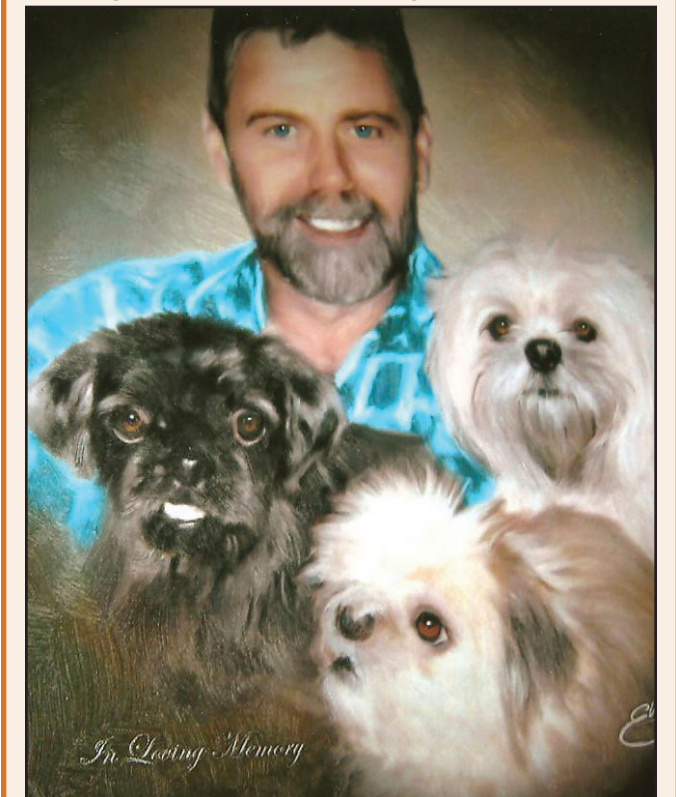
