

IPD arrests seven in drug bust

Location near South Irvine P-K Center was called a "high priority"

Cockrell's bail was set at \$100,000 cash. Thomas Scott Reeves, 35, of McKee Road, Irvine was charged with trafficking in a controlled substance, first degree; trafficking in a controlled substance, second degree; trafficking in marijuana; trafficking within 1000 feet of a school; and drug paraphernalia.

The citation states that during the course of a drug related search, Officer John Sturniolo had observed Reeves doing a hand to hand drug exchange.

Reeves was detained during the execution of the search warrant, and it states that Reeves had in his possession approximately 1.5 grams of marijuana; 25 suboxone half moon 155 pills; 12 suboxone AN415 pills; two open and eight unopened suboxone sublingual films, 5 oxycodone 224; 4 oxycodone

R215; 3 oxycodone M/30; 1 oxycodone ALG265; 1 oxycodone K9; 1 oxycodone V/4812; 1 metal pill crusher; 1 white plastic container; a cell phone; metal pill container; and \$312 in cash.

James Rose, the apparent owner of Rose's Garage, was arrested at the Irvine Police Station the following evening.

Rose, 58, of 860 South Irvine Road, was charged with complicity to traffick in a controlled substance, first and complicity to traffic in a controlled substance within 1000 feet of a school.

The citation states that Rose was read his Miranda warning and waived his rights. It adds that he told Officer Sturniolo that he knew illegal drug sales were being made at his place of business.

The citation also states that Rose received \$30 a week payment from Cockrell and \$10

a week from Reeves. It also adds that Rose received lortabs 7.5 mg, marijuana joints, klonapin, and valium from Cockrell and Reeves.

The other two men arrested were George Fox of Churchhouse Hill Road, Irvine and Blain Martin of Berea.

The search warrant does not indicate that IPD found any illegal items on Fox. He was arrested on two warrants from Estill District Court for failing to appear in court.

Martin was charged with possession of marijuana and possession of drug paraphernalia.

Karen L. Wilson, 49, of Richmond Road, Irvine was cited on a misdemeanor charge of drug paraphernalia. During the search, IPD says they found three cut straws with white powder residue and two empty plastic wrappers with white powder residue.

She was arrested on a failure to appear warrant.

IPD says they located one and a half perocets and a klonopine pill on Cheryl Embs, 46. She was cited for possession of a controlled substance, both first and third degrees.

Preliminary hearings are set for today, August 13, in Estill District Court for those charged with felonies. The purpose of a preliminary hearing is to determine if there is enough evidence to present the case to the grand jury. The Estill Grand Jury met yesterday. If indictments were returned against those involved in the drug bust, their preliminary hearings are cancelled.

All officers of the Irvine Police Department assisted with the investigation and execution of the search warrant.

Furnace man faces many charges after Thursday incident

Kentucky State Police arrested a man on numerous charges Thursday evening at Phyllis Ann Court, Irvine.

Post 7 in Richmond dispatched Trooper T. Robinson to the residence because of a possibly suicidal male.

A resident said that Zachary A. Schooler, 21, of Furnace Junction, Ravenna had called her and said he had a gun and was going to kill himself. The woman told KSP the man was enroute to her residence.

The trooper said he observed Schooler's vehicle when he arrived at the woman's residence. He added that he heard a lot of screaming and yelling coming from a male's voice.

The trooper said he found the victim and the man in the living room. He asked the male to come outside to talk to him. He said that Schooler voluntarily went outside.

The citation states that Schooler had a strong odor of alcohol and was foaming at the mouth.

According to the citation,

Schooler then got irate with the trooper. He threatened to shoot and kill the trooper as well as himself.

The trooper handcuffed Schooler and took him to Marcum & Wallace Memorial Hospital.

The citation states that he began screaming and yelling at the nurses and trooper. It adds that he spat on the trooper's uniform and kicked him. He reportedly told the nurses to get their hands off him or he was going to harm them.

The trooper said he placed Schooler back into the cruiser and took him to the Estill County Jail.

Schooler was charged with public intoxication (excluding alcohol), menacing, resisting arrest, assault third degree police officer, third degree terroristic threatening, second degree disorderly conduct, and three charges where the violation was not stated.

Bail and court dates for Schooler were not available.

4-wheeler recovered in Owsley County

A 4-wheeler stolen in Estill County several months ago was recovered in Owsley County last Wednesday by Deputy Randy Farthing.

Farthing said he received information that the stolen 4-wheeler had been sold to William Smith of Booneville.

Farthing contacted Smith who still had the 4-wheeler. He told the deputy that he had paid \$700 to an Estill County man for the green Yamaha Big Bear.

The 4-wheeler was reported stolen May 15 from White Oak Stables by its owner, John Flynn. It was valued at \$1,000.

According to Farthing, the 4-wheeler had damage to its right front fender, which Flynn said was caused by a cow.

The 4-wheeler was turned over to Deputy Farthing.

Charges are pending against the Estill man who sold the 4-wheeler to Smith.



Deputy charges man with forgery

A North Irvine man was arrested on two different citations issued August 4 by Deputy Doc Morris.

Morris arrested John R. Dunaway, 23, of Wall Street, Irvine for three counts of criminal possession of a forged instrument.

Morris said that on August 1, Dunaway cashed two checks at local businesses on an account belonging to Dunaway and Sons. The deputy stated both of those checks had been forged.

After Dunaway's arrest and during a search, Morris found a third check which had also been forged. He charged Dunaway

with promoting contraband, second degree.

Dunaway was taken to the Estill County Detention Center. Morris said he asked Dunaway several times if he had any contraband and he said no. The deputy sheriff said that during a search, the deputy jailer found a white plastic bag containing a white crystal subject. Morris said that Dunaway told him it was cocaine.

Dunaway was then charged with promoting contraband, first degree and possession of a controlled substance, first degree and first offense.

Man threatens couple in library parking lot

One man was arrested Saturday afternoon following an altercation in the parking lot of the Estill County Public Library.

Captain Adrian McKinney arrested Cornelius Wilson Jr., 53, of Stacy Lane, Irvine on two counts of wanton endangerment first degree.

The police captain said the two victims told him that Wilson had accused the male victim of blackening his son's eye.

The victims told McKinney that when Wilson got out of his car, he had a baseball

bat that he used to threaten them with. Then the victims stated that Wilson took a small, double barrel silver pistol out of his left rear pocket and pointed at them.

McKinney stated the weapon the victims described was found locked in Wilson's vehicle.

Wilson's bail was set at \$2,500 cash The bail was posted on Saturday and he was released from custody. He will be arraigned on the charge on September 29 in Estill District Court.

Ms. Brooks was released from custody on a \$5,000 surety bond. She will be arraigned on the charges in Estill District Court on Sept. 29.

Farthing said that Alline Hinds called to report that a bolt had come off a state mower and had gone through her house.
