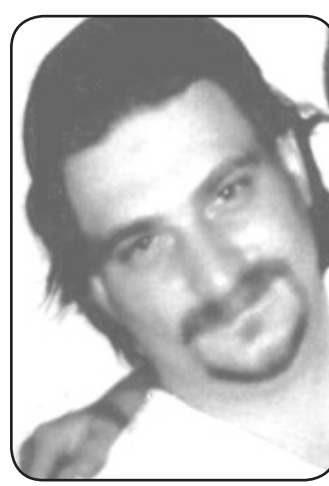
Shelby "Little Bit" Spencer, 42
