

Students From Estill Visit Morehead Early College Program

Students from Estill County High School visited the Morehead State University campus, as part of the Early College Program, Tuesday, Aug. 12. More than 50 high and technical schools offered MSU classes during the fall semester with more than 2,000 high school students participating in the program.

"This program is truly a win-win opportunity. Students get to earn college credit for free or at a much reduced rate, parents have less financial burden for a college education and schools get challenging new courses which fully optimize the talents of their high schools," said Joel Pace, director of early col-

lege programs. MSU and the partner schools are collaborating to meet a goal of 24 college credits for all high school students before they graduate. A minimum 3.0 grade point average and an 18 composite ACT score are necessary to be admitted to the program. Students also must meet

any specific requirements that are course related. Students enrolled in courses taught by MSU faculty on the Morehead campus, at one of our regional campuses, or online during the semester will receive a 60 percent scholarship and would be responsible for the remaining tuition for their

courses. Students enrolled in courses instructed by approved faculty in their school system will continue to receive a full waiver for the cost of tuition. Additional information is available by calling Pace at 606-783-2995 or you can find an application at www.moreheadstate.edu/earlycollege/.

The Principles of Authority

In the holy scriptures all of the principles of authority can be traced to our Lord as He has said in **Matthew 25:18-20**. "All power (authority) is given unto me in heaven and in earth." If this passage is true and I believe that it is, then men have no farther to look unto than the New Testament for the directions for life here and eternity. What we are looking at today are the principals of authority related to the facts and truths about Jesus. We ask, does our Lord have the right to command certain actions of men? Does he have the right to command respect, and for His authority to be recognized as truth, because only truth is critically important to the salvation of souls. Then if there is no truth, there is nothing for us to hold onto. However, Jesus claimed in **John 14:6**, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the father but by me." So if there is no truth, there is no freedom from sin, but Jesus said in **John 8:32**, "And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." And if there is no freedom from sin we are doomed to destruction. But the scriptures teach that freedom from sin is obtained through obedience to the gospel of Jesus Christ (**Romans 1:1-17** and **Hebrews 5:8-9**).

So then, if the words of authority are rejected by men, what then? But Jesus has said in **John 12:48**, "He that rejects me, and receives not my words, has one that judges him: the word that I have spoken, the same shall judge him in the last day." NKJV.

But even at this warning we have people in this world who are rejecting the authority of our Lord, both in religious activities and in the open sinful world also. So if people would only open the Bible and read passages, such as **Revelation 6:12-17** and also **Revelation 20:11-15**, this might awaken the reality that all of us shall stand and give an accounting of our actions of life before the great judgment seat of Jesus one day. **II Corinthians 5:11** guarantees it to be true. My question today is: "What are we doing with Jesus, or what do we aim to do soon?" Remember, the Lord will return when men are not looking for him. What about you?

Everyone is welcome!

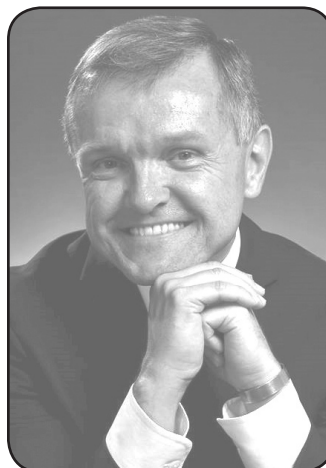


Sunday, August 17th @ 11am
