As a kid, September was a time for enjoying pretty much the last of the summer's vegetables—nubbins of late roastin' ears, Tommy toes which always seemed to last longer than their larger cousins, and of course various types of melons. Daddy had built shelves in the cool basement to hold summer's bounty of Mason jars that held many kinds of vegetables. The apples and pears were harvested and stored at month's end.

Things have changed immeasurably since then, but early autumn is still a "cleaning out" time when it comes to food, especially meat and wild game. If there's any left it's time for meat pies. Mom prepared many Shepherd's Pies from left over meat and vegetables.

#### SHEPHERD'S PIE

2 cups green beans 2 cups carrots

- 1 pound left over beef roast or ground meat
- onion, finely chopped 1 cup chopped mush
- rooms (optional) large can tomato sauce
- pound cooked mashed potatoes THE REAL THING— leftovers work just fine

Salt and pepper to taste

Stir round beef/roast with onions and mushrooms. Drain if necessary. Add tomato sauce and seasonings.

In a deep baking dish layer green beans, carrots, meat and tomato sauce mixture; top with mashed potatoes and sprinkle grated cheese on top (optional). Bake at 350 degrees for about 30 minutes or until heated through.

In our frantic lives God expects us to rest in Him, trust in Him, take time for Him and worship Him. If we do not follow His pattern He may even force His rest upon us in ways we would not choose. We need the benefits that come from resting in Him and with Him.
