In Acts 9, here is the story of this man named Saul of Taursus. This man was extremely active in his quest to try to stamp out all Christianity. But his mission was all wrong and it took a personal meeting with our Lord to straighten him out. The story tells us that he was on a journey to Damascus to arrest and put in prison all those who named Christ as their Lord. At this time Saul, well versed in the Old Testament, disbelieved that Jesus was the promised Messiah. At this time the Lord sent a powerful beam of light so intense that the man Saul was thrown to the ground. Then this voice came from heaven saying, "Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou me?
