Last week, spent a day preparing and freezing banana, habanero and bell peppers. One of my sisters had a bumper crop of peppers this year and shared them with me.

Bob and I started working on the peppers early last Wednesday morning. We donned aprons, knives, and scoops and began our fiery journey.

At first, it didn't seem too bad; then, eyes started burning and Bob began sneezing. I tried to get him to wear rubber gloves, but he would not do that and his hands were red and burning. Although

we did a lot of sneezing, we accomplished our mission. We had about 20 bags of peppers.

If you have never had fried banana peppers, you are missing a real treat.

I slice the pepper in half, scoop the seeds out, rinse, and then cut them in half across and place them in a cookie sheet and freeze; and then, when they are frozen, I place them in a bag. Freezing on the cookie sheet before helps keep from getting them all mashed together when frozen. They are easier to get apart when deep frying.

I use several different coatings when I deep fry my peppers. Sometimes, I use the Kentucky Kernal seasoned flour, or pancake mix, or fish fry mix. The best seasoning we have found that we like is Larry the Cable Guy's seasoning mix. It is delicious.

Here are some hot tips when preparing peppers:

- Protect your fingers by wearing rubber gloves when handling hot peppers to prevent burning sensation caused by the release of cap-

salcin when peppers are cut.

• Cooking tends to reduce the heat provided by hot peppers and horse radish.

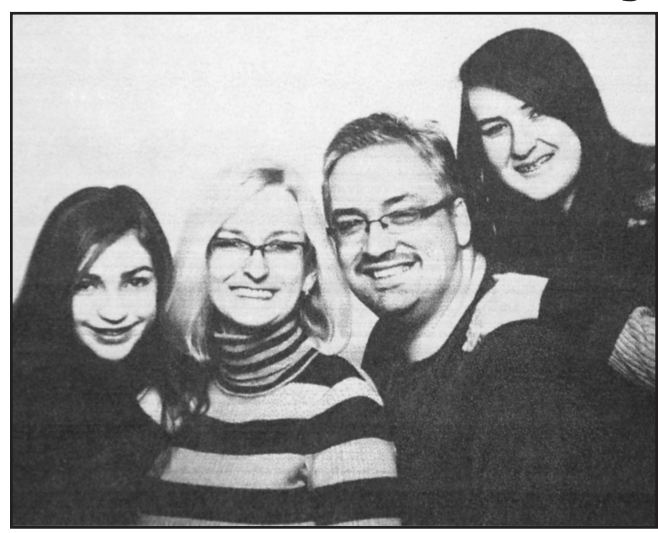
• Milk, yogurt and other dairy products quiet the burn, while water just seems to make things sizzle more.

If the piles of peppers that brighten the farmers' markets in early fall offer any indication, things are heating up in many American kitchens. As few as 15 years ago, ground black pepper prepared horse radish, and creamy mustard provided the only pungency many Americans experienced in their daily diet. We have definitely expanded

to include more spicy food; as evidenced with the large number of Mexican restaurants in our area.

What Will Thou Have Me to Do?

In Romans 8:31-32, Paul wrote these words: "What shall we then say to these things? If God be for us, who can be against us? ³²He that spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for us all, how shall he not with him also freely give us all things? "

First of all, our Lord gives us hope by his own resurrection from the grave. In I Corinthians 15:19-20 again he wrote: "If in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all men most miserable. ²⁰But now is Christ risen from the dead, and become the firstfruits of them that slept." Then in Verse 22 he says: "For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ shall all be made alive." So then, Christians are the only ones who have hope of life eternal, if they have obeyed our Lord unto salvation.

Secondly, this hope is made real when we are baptized into Jesus Christ for the remission of our sins. Romans 6:4, "Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life." In Ephesians 1:13, "In whom ye also trusted, after that ye heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation: in whom also after that ye believed, ye were sealed with that holy Spirit of promise." So then, every obedient Christian is stamped with our Lord's approval if they have touched his cleansing blood. This is called circumcision of the heart, and our Lord knows each one of them.

Thirdly, the obedient Christian should have no fear of death. In John 14:23-24 Jesus said, "If a man love me, he will keep my words: and my Father will love him, and we will come unto him, and make our abode with him. ²⁴He that loveth me not keepeth not my sayings: and the word which ye hear is not mine, but the Father's which sent me." Then John wrote in I John 4:18, "There is no fear in love; but perfect love casteth out fear: because fear hath torment. He that feareth is not made perfect in love." So again, if you are afraid of your future outcome of life, maybe it is time to reevaluate your personal life. Our Lord said to the church at Smyrna (Chapter 2:10 of Revelation), "... be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life."

In closing, as a professed Christian, were you faithful in church attendance last week? Not just for an hour, but the evening service and to include Wednesday evening Bible study as well? Did you partake of the Lord's supper as did the early church (Acts 20)? Did you help to undergird the Lord's work by giving of your money as you were prospered? I Corinthians 16:1-2 says the early church did so. If not will you make it up next Sunday? Did you help encourage your brother and sister by your attendance as says Hebrews 10:23-25 or did you forsake this day for something you loved better? Let me ask this question, if the Lord were to return next Sunday, where would you meet him? Only you will make this decision, but since we are uncertain of the hour, what would be the wise thing to do? I believe you already know the answer.

Think about it, our Lord is coming soon again! Attend with us, and let us help you to prepare.
